five architects originally published in 1975 grew out of a meeting of the case group conference of architects for the study of the environment held at the museum of modern art in 1969 the purpose of this gathering was to exhibit and criticize the work of five architects eisenman graves gwathmey hejduk and meier who constituted a new york school and who are now among the most influential architects working today the buildings shown here have more diversity than one might expect from a school but share certain properties of form scale and treatment of material collectively their work makes a modest claim it is only architecture not the salvation of man and the redemption of the earth providing complete drawings and photographic documentation this collection also includes a comparative critique by kenneth frampton an introduction by colin rowe that suggests a still broader context for the work

as a whole and two short texts in which individual positions are outlined now back in print five architects serves as a reference to the early work of some of america s most important architects and provides us with a glimpse back at the direction of architecture as they saw it over twenty years ago
