for centuries christian missions have intervened in local religious communities practices and ideas across the globe generating encounters between indigenous and western cultures that have ranged from hostile confrontation to intercultural osmosis while primarily intended as a strategy for evangelisation forms of inculturation also led to the emergence of new hybrid cultural and religious expressions these creative processes were rarely unidirectional instead they involved reciprocal cultural transactions in which local communities exerted significant agency cross cultural heritage deepens our understanding of the intricate relationships between missions and missionised communities these are reflected in the material and immaterial legacies of missionary histories in various contexts in south america africa asia the pacific and europe often they remain deeply rooted in landscapes memories and practices today

togo s history from precolonial times to the present is one of a struggle for identity and leadership a territory relatively untouched by neighboring pre colonial empires was colonized by both the germans and the french and even before independence togo was shaped by the struggle for political control by prominent families since the 1990s widespread political movements have striven to unseat the ruling gnassingbé family in power for more than 50 years only to be repressed by the military or thwarted at the ballot box economically more prosperous compared to many of the other countries in the west african region togo has diversified its economy from an early dependence on phosphates and has navigated trade and foreign relations remarkably well for a country of only 7 million people with a territory less than a quarter the size of neighboring ghana with at least 30 ethnic groups and wide array of languages religions and cultural traditions togo is representative of the rich diversity of contemporary africa and a vibrant illustration of the dual quest for development and democracy that characterizes the west african region the fourth edition of historical dictionary of togo contains a chronology an introduction an extensive bibliography and a dictionary section has over 1 000 cross referenced dictionary entries on important personalities politics economy foreign relations religion and culture this book is an excellent resource for students researchers and anyone wanting to know more about

togo is a small west african country nestled between benin and ghana extending from its narrow coastline 320 miles inland to burkina faso although the country s phosphate production has given it a modicum of economic stability togo remains politically unstable the third edition of the historical dictionary of togo expands and updates the 1987 edition and includes events occurring after the previous edition written by one of the foremost experts on african politics this indispensable reference source provides concise dictionary entries covering the people places events political and economic institutions history and culture of this fascinating country it contains a comprehensive multilingual bibliography divided according to subject tables with important economic and demographic data a list of abbreviations an updated chronology of recent political events and three maps covering transport and communications administrative divisions and ethnic divisions reviews of the previous edition there is much valuable information in this work that would not be retrieved easily elsewhere highly recommended arba a worthwhile contribution the bibliography succeeds admirably in drawing these sources together africa
