the latest book in a series that seeks to illuminate francis bacon s art and motivations and open up fresh and stimulating ways of understanding his paintings francis bacon was one of the most important artists of the twentieth century his works continue to puzzle and unnerve viewers raising complex questions about their meaning over recent decades two theoretical approaches to bacon s work have come to hold sway first that bacon is an existential painter depicting an absurd and godless world and second that he is an antirepresentational painter whose primary aim

is to expose his work directly to the spectator's nervous system. Francis Bacon draws together some of today's leading philosophers and psychoanalytic critics to go beyond established readings of Bacon and open up radically new ways of thinking about his art. The essays bring Bacon into dialogue with figures such as Aristotle, Georg Hegel, Sigmund Freud, Jacques Lacan, Theodor Adorno, and Martin Heidegger and situate his work in the broader contexts of modernism and modernity. The result is a timely and thought-provoking collection that will be essential reading for anyone interested in Bacon, modern art, and contemporary aesthetics.

Gilles Deleuze was one of the most influential and revolutionary philosophers of the twentieth century. Francis Bacon: The Logic of Sensation is his long-awaited work on Bacon, widely regarded as one of the most radical painters of the twentieth century. The book presents a deep engagement with Bacon's work and the nature of art. Deleuze analyzes the distinctive innovations that came to mark Bacon's style: the isolation of the figure, the violation/deformations of the flesh, the complex use of color, the method of chance, and the use of the triptych form. Along the way, Deleuze introduces a number of his own famous concepts such as the body without organs and the diagram, and contrasts his own approach to painting with that of both the phenomenological and the art historical traditions. Deleuze links Bacon's work to Cézanne's notion of a logic of sensation which reaches its summit in color and the coloring sensation. Investigating this logic, Deleuze explores Bacon's crucial relation to past painters such as Velázquez, Cézanne, and Soutine, as well as Bacon's rejection of expressionism and abstract painting. Long awaited in translation, Francis Bacon is destined to become a classic philosophical reflection on the nature of painting.

The most comprehensive collection available of Bacon's philosophical and scientific writings, this volume offers Bacon's major works in their entirety or in generous selections. Revised from the classic 19th-century editions of Spedding, Ellis, and Heath, selections from Bacon's natural histories round out this edition by showing the types of compilations that he believed would most contribute to the third part of his great instauration. In her general introduction, Rosemary Sargent sketches Bacon's early life, education, and legal career and discusses the major components of his philosophical works and traces his influence on subsequent natural philosophy.

It is the contention of the editors and contributors of this volume that the work carried out by Gilles Deleuze, where rigorously applied, has the potential to cut through much of the intellectual sedimentation that has settled in the fields of music studies. Deleuze is a vigorous critic of the Western intellectual tradition, calling for a philosophy of difference. And despite its ambitions, he is convinced that Western philosophy fails to truly grasp or think difference as such. It is argued that longstanding methods of conceptualizing music are vulnerable to

deleuze's critique but as deleuze himself stresses more important than merely critiquing established paradigms is developing ways to overcome them and by using deleuze's own concepts this collection aims to explore that possibility

francis bacon introduced his contemporaries to a new way of investigating nature he called it natural and experimental history despite its rather traditional name bacon's natural and experimental history was a new discipline it comprised new ideas new practices and new models of collaborative research this new discipline was in many ways a surprisingly successful project it provided early modern naturalists with tools methods and models for both investigating nature and writing about their subject it also offered a set of norms and values for guiding research and yet this new discipline was not a science of nature it was more like an art this book aims to trace the emergence evolution and reception of francis bacon's art of experimental natural history

this collection of essays on francis bacon pays tribute to his legacy and influence the contributors consider the interdisciplinary scope of his art in relation to architecture continental philosophy critical theory gender studies and the sociology of the body and compare bacon with artists philosophers and writers who share similar concerns

how do we teach analysis in anthropology and other field based sciences how can we engage analytically and interrogatively with philosophical ideas and concepts in our fieldwork and how can students learn to engage critical ideas from philosophy to better understand the worlds they study philosophy on fieldwork provides show don't tell answers to these questions in twenty six master class chapters philosophy meets anthropological critique as leading anthropologists introduce the thinking of one foundational philosopher from a variety of western traditions and beyond and apply this critically to an ethnographic case nils bubandt thomas schwarz wentzer and the contributors to this volume reveal how the encounter between philosophy and fieldwork is fertile ground for analytical insight to emerge equally the philosophical concepts employed are critically explored for their potential to be thought otherwise through their frictional encounter with the worlds in the field allowing non western and non elite life experience and ontologies to speak back to both anthropology and philosophy this is a unique and concrete guidebook to social analysis it answers the critical need for a how to textbook in fieldwork based analysis as each chapter demonstrates how the ideas of a specific philosopher can be interrogatively applied to a concrete analytical case study the straightforward pedagogy of philosophy on fieldwork makes this an accessible volume and a must read for both students and seasoned fieldworkers interested in exploring the contentious middle ground between philosophy and anthropology

the writings of gilles deleuze and felix guattari offer the most enduring and controversial contributions to the theory and practice of art in post war continental thought however these writings are both so wide ranging and so challenging that much of the synoptic work on deleuzo guattarian aesthetics has taken the form of sympathetic exegesis rather than critical appraisal this rich and original collection of essays authored by both major deleuzian scholars and practicing artists and curators offers an important critique of deleuze and guattari s legacy in relation to a multitude of art forms including painting cinema television music architecture literature drawing and installation art inspired by the implications of deleuze and guattari s work on difference and multiplicity and with a focus on the intersection of theory and practice the book represents a major interdisciplinary contribution to deleuze guattarian aesthetics

francis bacon was an english philosopher statesman and scientist bacon served as attorney general and lord chancellor of england and his works have remained influential overtime as his ideas helped lead to the scientific revolution bacon has often been referred to as the father of empiricism valerius terminus is a book in which bacon presents a detailed study of the limitations of knowledge and the nature of the human mind

francis bacon 1st viscount st albans was an english philosopher statesman scientist lawyer jurist author and pioneer of the scientific method he served both as attorney general and lord chancellor of england although his political career ended in disgrace he remained extremely influential through his works especially as philosophical advocate and practitioner of the scientific method during the scientific revolution bacon has been called the father of empiricism his works established and popularised inductive methodologies for scientific inquiry often called the baconian method or simply the scientific method his demand for a planned procedure of investigating all things natural marked a new turn in the rhetorical and theoretical framework for science much of which still surrounds conceptions of proper methodology today his dedication probably led to his death bringing him into a rare historical group of scientists who were killed by their own experiments bacon was knighted in 1603 and created both the baron verulam in 1618 and the viscount st alban in 1621 as he died without heirs both peerages became extinct upon his death he famously died of pneumonia contracted while studying the

effects of freezing on the preservation of meat

the conversations generated by the chapters in music's immanent future grapple with some of music's paradoxes that music of the western art canon is viewed as timeless and universal while other kinds of music are seen as transitory and ephemeral that in order to make sense of music we need descriptive language that to open up the new in music we need to revisit the old that to arrive at a figuration of music itself we need to posit its starting point in noise that in order to justify our creative compositional works as research we need to find critical languages and theoretical frameworks with which to discuss them or that despite being an auditory system we are compelled to resort to the visual metaphor as a way of thinking about musical sounds drawn to musical sound as a powerful form of non verbal communication the authors include musicologists philosophers music theorists ethnomusicologists and composers the chapters in this volume investigate and ask fundamental questions about how we think converse write about compose listen to and analyse music the work is informed by the philosophy primarily of Gilles Deleuze and Felix Guattari and secondarily of Michel Foucault Julia Kristeva and Jean-Luc Nancy the chapters cover a wide range of topics focused on twentieth and twenty-first century musics covering popular musics art music acousmatic music and electro acoustic musics and including music analysis music's ontology the noise music dichotomy intertextuality and music listening ethnography and the current state of music studies the authors discuss their philosophical perspectives and methodologies of practice-led research including their own creative work as a form of research music's immanent future brings together empirical cultural philosophical and creative approaches that will be of interest to musicologists composers music analysts and music philosophers
