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the art institute of chicago museum studies published twice annually presents articles on the collections and history of the art institute this issue is devoted to the art of the early twentieth century a masterpiece by henri matisse bathers by a river pictured below is examined another article explores matisse s relationship with the russian collector sergei shchukin other essays discuss katharine kuh the museum s first curator of twentieth century painting and sculpture lovis corinth s late self portrait and a projected but never realized project for chicago constantin brancusi s endless column page 4 of cover

this special issue of museum studies explores the broad history and practice of art education at the art institute charting the museum s past present and future vision of what museum education can be and do drawing from a rich trove of archival oral and photographic resources authors offer a lively account of museum education as an evolving profession an outlet for aesthetic and political programs and a crucial element of the art institute s public mission from the moment of its founding in 1879 the project sponsored by the woman s board of the art institute of chicago to commemorate its fiftieth anniversary also explores that group s signal commitment to education and

volunteerism at the museum which has ranged from creating suburban community associations to sponsoring a corps of volunteer docents from establishing a pioneering children's museum to planning celebrations that open the art institute's doors to the widest possible public a pathbreaking effort this publication constitutes an important unique contribution to the history of education in american cultural institutions

in 2016 the school of the art institute of chicago saic reached its 150th year what sustains an institution is sometimes extraordinary sometimes mundane and often simply a matter of the sheer will of those involved an unparalleled museum school saic embodies something greater than the individuals who have passed through it and yet it has also depended upon the unique and special nature of its protagonists its founders who survived the great chicago fire and rebuilt the school a president who cast the hands and face of abraham lincoln an alumna who was a celebrated illustrator and an activist in the women's suffrage movement the creators of monumental sculptures throughout the country and numerous scholars of art history and technique to challenge and shape its form the school's history is punctuated by marvelous moments of heightened public discourse in art making and scholarship this book represents a glimpse into the lives of generations of students staff and faculty as full participants in an astounding learning environment

a roster of prominent artists curators and scholars offers a new entirely contemporary approach to our understanding of photography and media focusing on the art institute of chicago's deep and varied collection of photographs books and other printed matter installation art photobooks albums and time based media this ambitious wide ranging volume features short essays by prominent artists curators university professors and independent scholars that explore topics essential to understanding photography and media today the essays organized around themes ranging from the expected to the esoteric are paired with key objects from the collection in order to address issues of aesthetics history philosophy power relations production and reception more than 400 high quality reproductions amplify the authors arguments and suggest additional dialogues across conventional divisions of chronology genre geography and technology an introductory essay by matthew s witkovsky traces the museum's history of acquisitions and how the evolution of the museum's collection reflects broader changes in the critical reception of the field of photography and media distributed for the art institute of chicago

in the early 1920s a young pittsburgh artist and designer willis dresdale shook recognized the need for a two year course in commercial art on october 1 1921 the artist's league of pittsburgh held its first class of nine students in one room of the fulton building within two years the name changed to the art institute of pittsburgh almost 90 years later shook's vision has grown to a community of more than 13 000 students and alumni of over 55 000 making their mark on the art design advertising motion picture entertainment business fashion and culinary industries worldwide the art institute of pittsburgh inspires pride in the accomplishments of students faculty and alumni along with chuckles at the outrageous memories that define the school's unmistakable essence and personality

an updated selection of key paintings at the art institute of chicago featuring works from around the globe and dating from ancient egypt to the present day the art institute of chicago one of the most beloved and important museums in the world houses an extraordinary collection of objects from diverse places cultures and time periods this beautiful catalogue opens the doors of the museum to readers presenting an expansive selection of painted works from around the globe introduced insightfully by james rondeau president and director of the art institute new color photography accompanies entries written by a team of curators art historians and educators which put the works into context the book showcases a dazzling range of paintings including an egyptian funeral portrait an ancient mexican wall mural chinese scroll paintings japanese painted screens

and works by artists such as caillebotte cassatt el greco gauguin homer hopper johns lichtenstein matisse mitsuoki monet morisot motley o keeffe picasso pollock rembrandt richter rubens sargent seurat tiepolo turner van gogh warhol whistler and wood contemporary artists featured include kerry james marshall wanda pimentel and kazuo shiraga

the history of american silver offers invaluable insights into the economic and cultural history of the nation itself published here for the first time the art institute of chicago s superb collection embodies innovation and beauty from the colonial era to the present in the 17th century silversmiths brought the fashions of their homelands to the colonies and in the early 18th new forms arose as technology diversified production demand increased in the 19th century as the industrial revolution took hold in the 20th modernism changed the shape of silver inside and outside the home this beautifully illustrated volume presents highlights from the collection with stunning photography and entries from leading specialists in depth essays relate a fascinating story about eating drinking and entertaining that spans the history of the republic and trace the development of the art institute s holdings of american silver over nearly a century

this comprehensive catalogue presents the institute s great collection of american paintings sculpture and decorative art including furniture silver and glass

marking an important moment in the art institute of chicago s 136 year history this book documents an exceptional gift to the museum the edlis neeson collection consisting of 44 stellar works of contemporary art among the highlights are major paintings by some of the 20th century s best known artists including jasper johns roy lichtenstein robert rauschenberg gerhard richter cy twombly and andy warhol also included in the gift are paintings photographs and sculptures by icons of contemporary art such as damien hirst jeff koons and cindy sherman this catalogue places the edlis neeson collection in direct dialogue with works already in the art institute s holdings an essay by james rondeau situates the gift in the context of the museum s history and uses it to illustrate the growth and development of pop art most importantly this book celebrates a transformative gift that allows the art institute to claim the most important collection of modern and contemporary art in any encyclopedic institution in the world

a family guidebook to the art institute of chicago and the art displayed there presenting entries on over sixty works from all areas of the museum s collections

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
