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examining the role of home and family in the latter part of the 20th century this book covers such subjects as the single parent institutions and homes the role of the mother in the family and domestic architecture and domestic life

in the japanese language the word ie denotes both the materiality of homes and family relations within the traditional family and family house often portrayed in ideal terms as key foundations of japanese culture and society have been subject to significant changes in recent years this book comprehensively addresses various aspects of family life and dwelling spaces exploring how homes household patterns and kin relations are reacting to contemporary social economic and urban transformations and the degree to which traditional patterns of both houses and households are changing the book contextualises the shift from the hegemonic post war image of standard family life to the nuclear family and to a situation now where japanese homes are more likely to include unmarried singles childless couples divorcees unmarried adult children and elderly relatives either living alone or in nursing homes it discusses how these new patterns are both reinforcing and challenging typical understandings of japanese family life

fusing audience research and ethnography the book presents a compelling account of women s changing lives and identities in relation to the impact of the most popular media culture in everyday life television within the historically specific social conditions of korean modernity youna kim analyzes how korean women of varying age and class group cope with the new environment of changing economical structure and social relations the book argues that television is an important resource for women stimulating them to research their own lives and identities youna kim reveals korean women as creative energetic and critical audiences in their responses to evolving modernity and the impact of the west based on original empirical research the book explores the hopes aspirations frustrations and dilemmas of korean women as they try to cope with life beyond traditional grounds going beyond the traditional anglo american view of media and culture this text will appeal to students and scholars of both korean area studies and media and communications studies
