surveys the history of youth unemployment and identifies key issues underlying the current crisis the youth unemployment crisis a reference handbook examines the recent phenomenon in the united states wherein young workers ages 16 to 24 are unemployed or disconnected from the labor force at disproportionate rates it describes in detail what led to the crisis who it affects and what can be and is being done about it the book opens with a chapter that addresses the nature and scope of the crisis which is followed by a discussion of the inherent problems controversies and possible solutions it includes essays from a diverse range of contributors providing useful perspectives to round out the author s expertise as well as a collection of data and documents an overview of important people organizations and resources relating to the crisis a chronology listing important events in the youth unemployment timeline and a glossary of key terms

monograph analyzing trends in youth unemployment in the usa examines economic implications and social costs of unemployment among dropouts and school leavers finds that educational level and vocational training have a positive effect upon the employment and wages of youth regardless of race and sex and stresses the urgency of employment creation especially for black youths and girls bibliography pp 143 to 152 and statistical tables

since the economic and financial crisis of 2008 the proportion of unemployed young people has exceeded any other group of unemployed adults this phenomenon marks the emergence of a laborscape this concept recognizes that although youth unemployment is not consistent across the world it is a coherent problem in the global political economy this book examines this crisis of youth unemployment drawing on international case studies it is organized around four key dimensions of the crisis precarity flexibility migration and policy responses with contributions from leading experts in the field the chapters offer a dynamic portrait of unemployment and how this is being challenged through new modes of resistance this book provides cross national comparisons both ethnographic and quantitative to explore the contours of this laborscape on the global national and local scales throughout these varied case studies is a common narrative from young workers families students volunteers and activists facing a new and growing problem this book will be an imperative resource for students and researchers looking at the sociology of globalization global political economy labor markets and economic geography

with the rate of young jobless in the eu still at nearly double its pre crisis level and the uk experiencing exceptionally high levels of unemployment this report calls on the government to rethink the way it uses european funding the government needs to use eu money to support the introduction of a youth guarantee rather than putting the funds towards existing domestic measures such as the youth contract the youth contract had underperformed and was not popular in the private sector while the youth guarantee had been successful in other european countries five regions in the uk were highlighted in the report as having unemployment levels so high that they qualified for additional eu funding these areas were tees valley durham west midlands south western scotland inner london and merseyside the committee is urging the government use the european funding to run pilot youth guarantee schemes in these five areas other recommendations made in the report include a move away from a centralised management of eu funds and make the most of local authorities and local enterprise partnerships who have links to specialist organisations in their areas when it comes to careers advice the government should use eu money to fund more traditional face to face careers advice rather than focusing on online support and more needs to be done to address the skills mismatch in the eu a particular example being in ict

the recent recession has led to an ongoing crisis in the youth labour market in europe this timely book deals with a number of areas related to the context choices and experiences of young people the consequences of which resonate throughout their lives the focus of the contributions to this volume is on issues which whilst undoubtedly important have thus far received less attention than they arguably deserve the first part of the book is concerned with issues related to education and training covering matters such as the role of monopsony in training the consequences of over education and the quality of educational institutions from primary to tertiary the second part is primarily concerned with the long term consequences of short term choices and experiences including contributions on health related choices health consequences later in life factors affecting the home leaving decision as well as an analysis of the increasing intergenerational

transmission of inequality a trend which accelerated during the recession the last part of the book deals with issues related to youth unemployment and neet the direct consequence of the recession this book contains a number of innovative analyses reporting significant findings that contrast with standard models some of the more interesting results directly contradict conventional wisdom on a number of topics from the importance of monopsony in training markets to the importance of transitory income changes on consumption of addictive goods this book is suitable for those who study labor economics political economy as well as employment and unemployment

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this report comments positively on some aspects of the design of the youth contract it builds on the types of interventions which have been shown to have a positive impact increased jobcentre plus jcp adviser support work experience placements and apprenticeships it also welcomes the inclusion of a new scheme for 16 17 year olds the large majority of whom do not receive support from jcp as they are ineligible for jobseekers allowance jsa the committee acknowledges that the government has sensibly focused wage incentives the key new element of the youth contract on longer term young unemployed claimants and there is an attempt to achieve sustainable job outcomes by linking wage incentives to the work programme payment structure in which providers are financially incentivised to keep participants in work and off benefits in the longer term however the youth contract on its own it will not be enough to address the current unacceptably high level of youth unemployment a significant impact can only be made if all the targets are met in particular past experience shows that 160 000 wage incentives is a very ambitious target in the current economic climate and 250 000 additional work experience placements for young people may also be unrealistic

in recent years the earnings of young blacks have risen substantially relative to those of young whites but their rates of joblessness have also risen to crisis levels the papers in this volume drawing on the results of a groundbreaking survey conducted by the national bureau of economic research analyze the history causes and features of this crisis the findings they report and conclusions they reach revise accepted

explanations of black youth unemployment the contributors identify primary determinants on both the demand and supply sides of the market and provide new information on important aspects of the problem such as drug use crime economic incentives and attitudes among the unemployed their studies reveal that contrary to popular assumptions no single factor is the predominant cause of black youth employment problems they show among other significant factors that where female employment is high black youth employment is low that even in areas where there are many jobs black youths get relatively few of them that the perceived risks and rewards of crime affect decisions to work or to engage in illegal activity and that churchgoing and aspirations affect the success of black youths in finding employment altogether these papers illuminate a broad range of economic and social factors which must be understood by policymakers before the black youth employment crisis can be successfully addressed

essay from the year 2013 in the subject leadership and human resources miscellaneous grade a atlantic international university course human resources language english abstract zimbabwe like most african countries faces a devastating and recurring problem of unemployment this phenomenon is common amongst the youth that make up more than 60 of the population worldwide this is a great challenge for all political parties as they use it to try and lure would be voters in 1990 the official unemployment rates stood at 12 and in 2012 they stood at 7 7 there has been a discord between the official rates and the studies done by private institutions the private rates for the two comparative years stand at 50 and 85 respectively it would be worth noting however that there are several rates for all these years depending on what the motive is for the research many of these figures contradict each other in many ways in 2006 the ilo deduced through a study that the unemployment rate was 95 and 70 amongst the youth the tendency has always been to follow the private rates as these tended to be for accurate and informative the government is conservative in their rates as they try to create a positive image in the eyes of the electorate this paper will critically look at the fluctuations in the numbers of the years the reasons for such high rates and why they fluctuated and the possible recourse available to the central government and other stakeholders it is imperative however to understand at this point that the author of this paper did not embark on a study but merely reviewed the available secondary data unemployment has ripple effects in any economy and zimbabwe is no exception the socio economic dimension is deep rooted and all consuming to the detriment of the ordinary zimbabwean

the book examines the socio economic dynamics of the current economic crisis that have affected southern european countries in general particularly greece and spain
