regardless of the field or discipline technology is rapidly advancing and individuals are faced with the challenge of adapting to these new innovations to remain up to date on the current practices teachers and administrators alike must constantly stay informed of the latest advances in their fields teacher training and professional development concepts methodologies tools and

applications contains a compendium of the latest academic material on the methods skills and techniques that are essential to lifelong learning and professional advancement including innovative studies on teaching quality pre service teacher preparation and faculty enrichment this multi volume book is an ideal source for academics professionals students practitioners and researchers

interest in and knowledge of leadership and learning separately and together is an international and continuing phenomenon this book adds to a somewhat under researched aspect of the field it focuses both on a particular form of leadership teacher leadership and on a particular form of learning professional development it considers the connection between teacher leadership and professional development and the first chapter relates this connection to a leadership for learning conceptual framework developed through an international three year project the book's chapters explore teacher leadership and professional development from a number of perspectives giving rise to three points of particular significance firstly the chapters show that either by accident or design there is a growing cadre of teacher leaders emerging from a multitude of professional development activities and initiatives secondly a number of new conceptual frameworks are put forward alongside the adaption and development of extant ones that add to the ever increasing theorisation of educational leadership and professional development literature thirdly the chapters provide evidence of the connections between leadership and learning as conceptualised in the leadership for learning framework this book was originally published as a special issue of professional development in education

in the era of education 5 0 institutions face a pressing challenge aligning educational policies and practices with the rapidly evolving demands of a digital interconnected world this transformation requires a fundamental shift in thinking that encompasses not only the content of education but also the methods and strategies used to impart knowledge issues of inclusivity

these proceedings present a selection of papers from the ictte 2021 conference while face to face classroom instruction is brought back there are a lot of lessons learned from the covid 19 pandemic that schools teacher training and education institutions and government have to take into account there is a need to reconsider what additional knowledge and skills pre service teachers and in service teachers need to be prepared for to anticipate such a similar unexpected situation in the future additionally there is also a need to listen to in service teacher experiences during the emergency remote teaching and integrate the positive lessons that they have gained such as the use of technology into the current post pandemic face to face classroom instruction this proceeding is designed for teacher educators researchers in service teachers and pre service teachers in the field of language education math and science education and social science education who are interested in these topics

with the ever changing climate of education around the globe it is essential that educators stay abreast of the most updated teaching methods and applications to do this fostering teacher education programs that include innovative practices and initiatives within the field is imperative the handbook of research on teacher education and professional development investigates current initiatives and approaches in educational programs focusing on research studies and theoretical concepts on innovative projects related to teacher education and

professional development programs this book is a pivotal reference source for academics professionals students practitioners and researchers

the importance of professional development for teachers cannot be overstated in recent years there has been much debate on how to raise standards in schools and it is now recognised by theorists policy makers and practitioners that the professional development of teachers is an important factor in this context for professional development co ordinators and senior management knowledge and understanding of the nature of professional development roles and human resource management theories will provide a framework for practice this book includes chapters on managing professional development in a human resources context government policy initial teacher training the school development plan appraisal middle management leadership skills it will be of interest to co ordinators of professional development in schools and across local education authorities and to anyone who is part of a school s senior management team

this dissertation explores teachers informal learning experiences it examines a group of inquiry science teachers generating hypotheses about the nature of their informal learning experiences the resultant learning how those experiences affect their professional lives and the implications for education policy it also provides an example of how to operationalize informal learning measures within an evaluation of a particular professional development program the author conducted interviews with 20 teachers and used the interview results to develop an informal learning survey that was completed by 39 teachers results indicate that many teachers believe they do engage in valuable informal learning experiences this learning has the potential to influence the effectiveness of teachers formal learning experiences what teachers do in their classrooms and possibly students learning results of this dissertation and of follow up research can lead to increased effectiveness of teacher training programs by suggesting better design

and more efficient program administration by states and districts they can also provide the basis for improved research on teacher training effectiveness and help guide states and districts teacher recruiting efforts by identifying adults who have already acquired specific teaching relevant knowledge and skills

this highly practical guide is grounded in the authors experience setting up and running a successful professional development program to improve k 3 reading instruction the book systematically describes how professional development works how sessions are organized what they contain routines and procedures and the roles of each participant teacher educators literacy specialists and coaches also get invaluable information on the nuts and bolts of accountability management resource allocation and reporting to multiple audiences many specific illustrations and examples are included as are sample forms and other planning materials that can be adapted to the needs of particular schools districts or states

like other big city school systems chicago s has been repeatedly reformed over the last century yet its schools have fallen far short of citizens expectations and left a gap between the performances of white and minority students many blame the educational establishment for resisting change other critics argue that reform occurs too often still others claim it comes not often enough dorothy shipps reappraises the tumultuous history of educational progress in chicago revealing that the persistent lack of improvement is due not to the extent but rather the type of reform throughout the twentieth century managerial reorganizations initiated by the business community repeatedly altered the governance structure of schools as well as the relationships of teachers to children and parents but brought little improvement while other more promising reform models were either resisted or crowded out shipps chronicles how chicago s corporate actors led abetted or restrained nearly every attempt to transform the city s school system then asks whether schools might be better reformed by others to show why city

schools have failed urban children so badly she traces Chicago's reform history over four political eras revealing how corporate power was instrumental in designing and revamping the system her narrative encompasses the formative era of 1880-1930 when teachers unions moderated business plans previously unexplored business activism from 1930 to 1980 when civil rights dominated school reform and the decentralization of the 1980s she also covers the uneasy cooperation among business associations in the 1990s to install the mayor as head of the school system a governing regime now challenged by privatization advocates business people may be too wedded to a stunted view of educators to forge a productive partnership for change unionized teachers bridle at the second class status accorded them by managers if reform is to reach deeply into classrooms shipps concludes it might well require a new coalition of teachers unions and parents to create a fresh agenda that supersedes corporate interests this study clearly shows that in Chicago as elsewhere urban schooling is intertwined with politics and power by reviewing more than a century of corporate efforts to make education work shipps makes a strong case that it's high time to look elsewhere perhaps to educators themselves for new leadership
