renowned in his day as a mystic and theologian denis was born in 1402 in the belgian province of limburg which formerly comprised in the county of hesbaye died 12 march 1471 his birthplace was ryckel a small village a few miles from saint trond whence ancient writers have often surnamed him ryckel or à ryckel sometimes called the last scholastic he penned over 150 works this is the first complete english translation of his most significant spiritual writings contemplation prayer meditation fountain of light and the paths of life and monastic profession he was also known as the last of the schoolmen devoted to prayer avid reader whose favorite author was pseudo dionysius author of commentaries sermons and theological and philosophical treatises he died on the 12 march 1471
