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this fascinating collection of essays contains a variety of perspectives about the use of expressive arts for facilitating physical and emotional healing each author within brings a fresh approach and unique experiences to their writing within these pages you will find many ideas for the use of the arts and can learn how to engage the inner layers of the self that allow natural healing processes of the body and soul to flourish when we fully engage an art modality we find ourselves in a place in our consciousness that could

be called healingspace where we feel ourselves whole and re member ourselves as well from psychic trauma to physical illness dis ease of many kinds may be addressed through the various techniques discussed here the tools offered by some authors are population specific and age appropriate while several authors have given us the philosophical underpinnings for it all while the authors within represent the grassroots voices of this new and rapidly expanding field several of them have developed their own methods for using the arts and have thriving practices our approach is wholistic music visual arts movement dance and poetry are discussed as separate modalities and in combination with one another in a process or flow the reader will engage in our experiences with these modalities as they have been lived the complementary cd that accompanies this book will allows the listener to have a full sound experience of toning if a rationale is needed for establishing arts programs in medical centers or other health facilities it can be found here the book offers tools for self development and for group facilitation those wanting to expand their healing practice through the use of the arts will find the book to be a faithful guide anyone wishing for a fuller understanding of how the arts may work to facilitate healing will find much food for thought within these pages

this book takes you on private visits to ten danish contemporary artists where we are allowed behind the scenes insight into the creative process we see both ongoing and completed works the materials tools and thought processes used through conversations with the artists we are party to their own stories as to why they became artists and how they arrived to where they are today what consumes them what drives them what inspires them 0after each artist portrait we are welcomed inside the individual homes of true art collectors some are vibrant and colourful others are monochrome and more subdued some are very feminine while others exude masculinity the common denominator is that they are brimming with art and that everything has been thought through they also happen to have a work by the artist we have just visited we ask what art means to them and show how they align themselves with the pieces

the who global strategy on human resources for health encourages development partners and global health initiatives to leverage their support to health systems in countries to strengthen sustainably the health workforce this impact assessment tool stems directly from an integrated conceptual model and it integrates relevant literature and novel empirical results that indicate positive associations among hrh investments four key treatment service indicators and health impact on the burden of hiv tb and malaria the tool can demonstrate the feasibility of estimating improvements in service treatment and lives saved for hiv tb and malaria deriving from investments in hrh by assessing and quantifying the health impact of hrh investments made in the context of hiv tuberculosis tb and malaria programmes through their modelled effect on health service coverage of these three diseases and providing aggregate indicative estimates of the range of health workers required to attain high coverage of selected health services the tool is targeted at planners and
