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giving academic presentations provides guidance on academic style presentations for advanced students a goal of the text is to make presenters aware that giving an effective academic presentation requires mastery of a broad range of skills among the topics covered in the book are analyses of speeches examination of different major speech types tips for improving non verbal behaviour suggestions for speaker listener interaction discussion of the importance of using evidence in academic speaking definitions and discussion of fillers advice on preparing ppt slides practical advice on preparing and practicing speeches and pronunciation work on pausing stress and intonation

an especially important goal of this text is to make presenters aware that giving an effective presentation requires mastery of a broad range of skills students will learn how to chose an appropriate topic create effective visuals and design a speech opening the text also provides an analysis of speeches examination of major speech types accompanying organizational strategies and related language use discussion of speech introductions and the importance of speech overviews or outlines tips for improving nonverbal behavior suggestions for speaker listener interaction analysis of ways to qualify claims and strategies for improving them and opportunities for evaluating one s work and the work of others book jacket

this book is for university students with at least a mid intermediate level of english it can be used as part of an english for academic purposes eap course either alone or with the

companion volume writing an academic paper in english the chapters are independent so that eap teachers and students can choose those sections that best fit their needs this means that a course could range from a minimum of 20 hours up to 60 hours or more there is an introductory chapter that includes what role academics play in today's world where success is not just measured in terms of paper output and presentations at conferences but also in involvement interdisciplinary projects and supporting society at large each chapter covers either a particular skill e.g. preparing a script pronunciation visuals how to begin and end a presentation or the particular purpose of a specific moment in a presentation for example the final slide is designed not just to conclude and thank the audience but is an opportunity to reach out for collaborations and assistance the aims of each part of a presentation are also highlighted by comparisons with non-academic situations where similar skills are required the course is highly practical with screenshots from real presentations given by phd students it is also designed to be fun to use other books in the series writing an academic paper in english essential english grammar and communication strategies adrian wallwork is the author of more than 40 elt and eap textbooks he has trained several thousand phd students and researchers from around 50 countries to write research papers and give presentations he is also the co-founder of e4ac.com an editing agency for non-native english speaking researchers

giving academic presentations is beyond any doubt one of the challenges most university students and teachers have to cope with however when these presentations are delivered in a foreign language the challenge is even greater if according to CEFR Council of Europe 2011 the level of fluency of the students trained to speak before an audience is B1 B2 the challenge might seem just too great to cope with if we consider the main principles of successful speakers to be confidence purpose and preparation then we can better comprehend the importance of communication apprehension moreover we should also

bear in mind that there are culturally specific influences on the way presentations are structured and that it is important to view a presentation as a process rather than a product because it is in the process of preparation itself that students become successful presenters in a foreign language
