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sonosyntactics introduces the reader to over forty five years of paul dutton s diverse and inventive poetry ranging from lyrics prose poems and visual work to performance texts and scores perhaps best known for his acclaimed solo sound performances and his contributions to the iconic sound poetry group the four horsemen dutton is a surprising witty sensitive and innovative explorer of language and of the human this volume gathers a representative selection of his most significant and characteristic poetry together with a generous selection of uncollected new work sonosyntactics demonstrates dutton s willingness to re invent and stretch language and to listen for new possibilities while at the same time engaging with his perennial concerns love sex music time thought humour the materiality of language and poetry itself gary barwin s introduction outlines the major subjects and techniques of dutton s poetry an intricate weaving of thought and language sound and emotion sound and sense and the unfolding of a text through the logic of language play such as puns paradoxes ambiguity and sound relations in an afterword by dutton himself the poet insightfully lays out the terms of his engagement with the materiality both visual and aural of language often beyond the purely recountable representational or depictive

how to read and write about poetry invites students and others curious about poetry to join the critical conversation about a genre many find a little mystifying even intimidating in an accessible engaging manner this book introduces the productive questions reading strategies literary terms and secondary research tips that will empower readers to participate in literary analysis holbrook explicates a number of poems initiating readers into critical discourse while highlighting key poetic terms

the explications are followed by selections of related works so the book thus offers what amounts to a brief anthology ideal for a poetry unit or introductory class on poetry and poetics a chapter on meter illuminates the rhythmic dimension of poetry and guides readers through methods of scansion the second edition is updated throughout and includes a fresh selection of poems and the latest mla citation guidance

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robert jay woff experienced a prolific career both as an artist and teacher in 1938 he was asked by bauhaus pioneer moholy nagy to be dean and head of the painting and sculpture department at chicago s new bauhaus reorganized under the name school of design from 1946 to 1964 he was the chairman of the art department at brooklyn college and from 1964 until 1969 he headed its graduate art program he also was a distinguished visiting lecturer at the graduate school of design at harvard as well as a visiting professor of art at the massachusetts institute of technology
