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this is the second volume in the Korean Grammar in Use series which is best selling book for the learners of Korean one of the most effective texts for learning Korean grammar along with the first volume beginning to early intermediate which

covered the major grammar points learned in most introductory levels 1 and 2 korean courses this intermediate volume covers the major grammar points learned in intermediate levels 3 and 4 korean courses together they form a full scale comprehensive korean reference grammar realizing that most other korean grammar books target beginning learners only the authors have answered the needs of intermediate level students who want a more systematic way to focus on grammar in addition this series serves as a general korean reference grammar that can be used by korean language instructors both in korea and abroad who experience first hand the difficulty of teaching korean grammar go beyond the basics to intermediate topik levels 3 4 grammar collects the introductory grammar points normally taught in levels 3 and 4 at most university affiliated and private language institutes in addition this volume includes practice pattern exercises to help students prepare for the topik intermediate level target grammar primary and secondary meanings at a glance organizes grammar points not as a list that simply must be learned but as integrated groups of grammar points with similar meanings usages and written forms to better illustrate their differences and provide learners with the various meanings restrictions and other things to keep in mind when learning them dialogues full of real life uses of grammar students will learn to make their own dialogues that use the target grammar points in ways most commonly used in real korean conversation the dialogues used are not simply sentences constructed for the purpose of illustrating grammar but rather examples that reflect practical real life korean conversations easy individualized use by both students and teachers not only can students more easily master a variety of difficult korean grammar points instructors can also benefit by having an accessible easy to use reference for explaining such difficult aspects of korean grammar in class

advanced korean offers a complete systematic and streamlined third year course in korean it is ideal for university students and adult learners with plentiful reading texts and written exercises all in korean hangul concise korean grammar notes in english extensive glossaries and an answer key make this book suitable for those studying alone as well as for classroom use there are 20 comprehensive lessons each with a reading text in which new language is introduced in context followed by vocabulary grammar points and exercises lessons 5 10 15 and 20 are short reviews of the key structural patterns introduced the focus is on written korean but the reading texts are not academic they are breezy chatty and amusing with illustrations the textbook comes with a downloadable supplement entitled sino korean companion it is for those learners wishing to commence the study of chinese characters as they are used in the korean language the 20 lessons build on the content of the lessons in the main textbook to introduce 500 chinese characters in their sino korean readings the emphasis

is on giving students the tools they need to decipher unfamiliar chinese characters on their own and also on sino korean vocabulary acquisition each lesson introduces approximately 25 30 new chinese characters along with related vocabulary items and builds on previous characters and vocabulary introduced demonstrating the cumulative effect on one s vocabulary of paying systematic attention to sino korean

having successfully weathered the structural problems of the 1979 81 period korea has begun far sighted programs of reform which it hopes will facilitate the industrial transition needed to push it towards the ranks of the industrialized countries the economy is thus in a period of rapid change and the conduct of public policy towards key sectors is undergoing a similar transformation this economic report therefore serves a number of purposes first it provides a review of recent economic developments and the principal issues influencing korea s achievement of its sixth five year plan goals second it addresses in a broad fashion the conduct of industrial policy and third it provides a selective yet in depth look at certain key topics related to macroeconomic and industrial policy with respect to industrial policy the korean incentive regime is assessed in light of the interventionist posture of government in the 1970s and the ensuing reform movement the process of trade and financial liberalization is analyzed and korea s industrial structure is discussed in some detail finally the formulation of future industrial policy is addressed and issues are identified with respect to declining industries conglomerate policy and emerging industries

migrants make choices plan their trajectories and engage with the authorities both in china and south korea migrant subjectivities among these groups are driven by and respond to the education migration regimes of both the sending and receiving countries as people in between they occupy flexible and multiple positionalities that are transnationally distributed however paradoxically they experience a juxtaposition of privilege integration and separation which is indicative of the chinese style of internationalisation the book adds weight to the argument that china is a temporary destination for foreigners and not one for long term settlement
