reading graphic design in cultural context explains key ways of understanding and interpreting the graphic designs we see all around us in advertising branding packaging and fashion it situates these designs in their cultural and social contexts drawing examples from a range of design genres leading design historians grace lees maffei and nicolas p maffei explain theories of semiotics postmodernism and globalisation and consider issues and debates within visual communication theory such as legibility the relationship of word and image gender and identity and the impact of digital forms on design their discussion takes in well known brands like alessi nike unilever and tate and everyday designed things including slogan t shirts car advertising ebooks corporate logos posters and music packaging

the graphic design reader brings together key readings in this ever changing field to provide an essential resource for students researchers and practitioners taking as its starting point an exploration of the way in which theory and practice and canons and anti canons have operated within the discipline the reader brings together writings by important international design critics including wendy siuyi wong dick hebidge april greiman and victor margolin extracts are structured into clear thematic sections addressing history education and the profession type and typography critical writing and practice political and social change changing visual landscapes and graphic design futures each section has a contextual introduction by the editors outlining key ideas and debates as well as an annotated guide to further reading and a comprehensive bibliography the graphic design reader features original visual essays which provide a critical platform for understanding and interpreting graphic design

practice as well as a wealth of illustrations accompanying key historical and contemporary texts from the 1920s to the present day

reading graphic design history uses a series of key artifacts from the history of print culture in light of their specific historical contexts it encourages the reader to look carefully and critically at print advertising illustration posters magazine art direction and typography often addressing issues of class race and gender david raizman's innovative approach intentionally challenges the canon of graphic design history and various traditional understandings of graphic design he re-examines icons of graphic design in light of their local contexts avoiding generalisation to explore underlying attitudes about various social issues he encourages new ways of reading graphic design that take into account a broader context for graphic design activity rather than broad views that discourage the understanding of difference and the means by which graphic design communicates cultural values with a foreword by steven heller
