from federal rebates for high efficiency appliances to bottle deposits to meatless Mondays practices promoting sustainability are now incorporated into our daily lives due to the establishment of protection agencies and the efforts of activist groups the wider public has become more conscious of the impact we humans make on the planet and what we can do to preserve what we have religious communities long concerned with broad issues of social

the bible teems with nonhuman life from its opening pages with god's creation of animals on the same day and out of the same earth as humans to its closing apocalyptic scenes of horses riding out of the sky animals are adam's companions noah's shipmates and elijah's saviors they are at the center of ancient israel's religious life as sacrifices and yet as job discovers beyond human dominion it is an animal that saves balaam from certain death by an angel's hand and an animal that carries jesus into jerusalem the creator declares all of them good at the beginning and since the apostle paul writes of god

s eternal purposes for all things on earth they are somehow part of a hoped for eschatological restoration so why are animals so often ignored in christian moral discourse in its theological thinking and faith motivated praxis human centeredness typically results in the complete erasure of the nonhuman this book argues that this exclusion of animals is problematic for those who see the bible as authoritative for the religious life instead biblical literature bears witness to a more inclusive understanding of moral duty and faith motivated largesse that extends also to eden s other residents

vatican ii s famous declaration that the church on earth is by its very nature missionary has often been taken out of context and used to support all manner of church initiatives but the conclusion of the statement since it has its origin in the mission of the son and the holy spirit is of monumental importance in the way of discipleship theologian anthony gittins describes the eternal mission of the trinity historically brought down to earth in the ministry of jesus and then continued to the ends of the earth by those called and sent as disciples throughout future generations gittins explains that christian discipleship must be the living out of jesus own example in many different times and places he encourages people of all ages to follow the invitation of jesus to be missionary disciples the way of discipleship explores several new testament examples of jesus call and commissioning distills the principles involved and then recontextualizes the stories so that they pose a direct challenge to disciples today in this way gittins builds up a picture both of the way of jesus himself and of the way in which today s disciples can loyally follow his call to mission
