this booklet was written by the first american string teacher to observe and study the suzuki method in japan mr john kendall kendall s gift is in large part his ability to bring the concepts and practicalities of the suzuki method to the doorstep of the american private and classroom teacher in language that can be readily understood the author takes a stab at clearing up the misconceptions sometimes applied to suzuki among them teaching en masse playing with recordings and a magic formula the booklet provides a succinct set of ten key factors in the talent education process begin at an early age regular listening lessons are private parents help with practice all music is memorized note reading is introduced later all students follow the same sequence of pieces carefully selected music cooperation not competition is the motivation flexibility and freedom of movement some totality of understanding some vision of the basic concepts is essential for an intelligent application of the ideas thus john kendall sums up his brilliant analysis of the talent education process always leaving the door open for the american teacher to tailor the basic philosophy to his or her unique teaching situation

in 1971 louise behrend collected a significant number of articles written about the suzuki approach these articles were published as a ten part series in allegro the monthly newspaper of the new york musicians union the purpose was to clear up many widely held misconceptions about the suzuki ideas and to encourage more fine players and teachers to explore suzuki teaching now published in book form this pioneering information becomes accessible to a much wider audience

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a comprehensive coverage of what the suzuki approach embodies this book should be considered a requirement in the home of every piano teacher and student eight of the 14 chapters lay the foundation for understanding suzuki s mother tongue approach its procedures and its benefits the authors have given their ideas of what it takes to be a suzuki teacher how to structure an effective lesson what to cover in those first lessons and how to do it using more than 400 musical examples the teaching points and the interpretation of the seven volumes of music are presented in addition some alternate fingerings are suggested and places where the suzuki edition departs from the original edition are noted

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this book details the life of shinichi suzuki and his work in developing the suzuki method of music instruction the book chronicles the struggle and efforts of the man now recognized as master musician and pioneer in music education chapters include 1 biography and history 2 growth of the talent education movement 3 dr suzuki s educational philosophy 4 conditioning 5 modeling behavior 6 curriculum and programmed instruction 7 use of learning machine technology 8 dr suzuki and zen the spiritual element and 9 replicating the suzuki magic in other disciplines the volume concludes with a glossary of terms notes and a 41 item bibliography eh

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it was suzuki s belief that talent can be developed in any child while nothing can be done about heredity much can be done regarding the environment his method is not just a means of playing an instrument it is a way of life that will enrich the child in countless ways creating professional musicians was not the goal of shinichi suzuki he believed that with the proper environment and educational process and through the medium of music sensitivity and understanding may be raised in children creating for each child a better life and for all a better world the suzuki repertoire consists of a selection and sequence of musical material appropriate to each instrument violin viola cello piano flute and harp in addition to pilot programs in bass and guitar from the standpoints of motor skills and emotional readiness the suzuki method has been used to nurture violinists for decades creating generations of successful musicians through the philosophy of shinichi suzuki this book brings yet another tool to the well rounded young artist a history of the composers and pieces that brings the suzuki repertoire to life

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
