The statutory powers of the police to investigate organized crime will be expanded; the efficiency of the prosecution service will be improved; the capacity of prisons will be increased; and crime prevention programmes will be intensified. Whether the relative mildness of the Dutch criminal justice system will be maintained in the future or not is a difficult question to answer. However, since the mildness is built into the system itself, as is demonstrated in this criminal justice profile, it is most probable that this mildness will be at least partly preserved in the future as well.
