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hundreds of anthologies of women's short stories have appeared in the literary market between the 1970s and now this publishing and cultural phenomenon is considered for the first time in this book which argues that during this period anthologies have become a literary technology used not only to make visible female short story writers but also to think about and mould ideas of womanhood through creative and contextualised readings of the most important anthologies produced in this period this study shows that this literary form has contributed to and in some cases pioneered key developments in gender theory and feminist thought including questions of political combination among women which underlie contemporary global movements such as metoo in doing so the book also develops the first book length conceptualisation of the features and meaning making mechanisms of the short story anthology as a literary form this book will benefit academics and students working in the fields of short fiction publishing and women's studies as well as feminist scholars and a growing number of specialists interested in the anthology as a literary form worldwide

essays tracing the evolving relationship between british women writers and the short story genre from the late nineteenth century to the present day what is the relationship between the british woman writer and the short story this collection examines what this versatile genre offers women writers and what this can tell us about the society and

culture they inhabit from the rise of the modern printing press at the end of the nineteenth century through to the present digital age these essays examine how the short story has been deployed and reworked by women writers and how they have influenced and shaped the genres development considering the effect of literary inheritances societal and cultural change and shifting publishing demands this collection traces the evolution of the genre through to its continued appeal to women writing today from the new woman to contemporary feminisms women s anthologies to microfiction modernist writers to the contemporary works of sarah hall and helen simpson the chapters in this collection investigate a crucial yet under examined field of british literature key features and benefits12 chapters discussing a range of gender and genre issues since the fin de sic e to the present day sets out a clear trajectory to map both the historical and literary connections and divergences between british women short story writers offers a comprehensive account of the genres development to provide scholars with a unique insight into a largely neglected aspect of womens writing includes new readings of canonical authors alongside more recent theoretical approaches innovations and lesser discussed writers

although indian women s short fiction has always enjoyed equal importance and popularity as their novels very little critical attention has been paid to it so far indian women s short fiction seeks to fulfil this long felt need it puts together fifteen perceptive and analytical articles by scholars across the world the articles which are focussed on native indian writing as well as diasporic short fiction deal with such interesting literary issues as construction of femininity disablement and enablement bengali heritage hybrid identities nostalgia representation of the partition violence tradition and modernity and cultural perspectivism it is hoped that the book will prove useful to scholars interested in short fiction studies in general and indian women s short fiction in particular

this collection of original and classic essays examines the contributions that female authors have made to the short story the introductory chapter discusses why genre critics have ignored works by women and why feminist scholars have ignored the short story genre subsequent chapters discuss early stories by such authors as lydia maria child and rose terry cooke others are devoted to the influences race class sexual orientation education that have shaped women s short fiction through the years women s special stylistic formal and thematic concerns are also discussed in this study the final essay addresses the ways our contemporary creative writing classes are stifling the voices of emerging young female authors the collection includes an extensive five part bibliography

known for her vivid portrayals of creole life in louisiana kate chopin 1851 1904 wrote during her brief literary career poignant and perceptive stories about the emotional lives of women bypassing many of the conventions of 19th century realism she won praise for her realistic portraits of the inhabitants of bayou and urban areas this collection of nine stories contains one of her most famous works désirée s baby a haunting and ironic tale of miscegenation additional stories include madame célestin s divorce a gentleman of bayou téche and at the cadian ball from bayou folk a respectable woman a night in acadie and azélie from a night in acadie the dream of an hour and the title story written with grace delicate humor and a keen understanding of the human especially the female psyche these stories are a superb introduction to an important american writer whose literary career was cut short by the harsh criticism directed at her novel the awakening 1899
