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this archaeological report provides a comprehensive study of the excavations carried out at amheida house b2 in egypt s dakhleh oasis between 2005 and 2007 followed by three study seasons between 2008 and 2010 the excavations at amheida in egypt s western desert begun in 2001 under the aegis of columbia university and sponsored by nyu since 2008 are investigating all aspects of social life and material culture at the administrative center of ancient trimithis the excavations so far have focused on three areas of this very large site a centrally located upper class fourth century ad house with wall paintings an adjoining school and underlying remains of a roman bath complex a more modest house of the third century and the temple hill with remains of the temple of thoth built in the first century ad and of earlier structures architectural conservation has protected and partly restored two standing funerary monuments a mud brick pyramid and a tower tomb both of the roman period this is the second volume of ostraka from the excavations amheida ancient trimithis in egypt it adds 491 items to the growing corpus of primary texts from the site in addition to the catalog the introductory sections make important contributions to understanding the role of textual practice in the life of a pre modern small town issues addressed include tenancy the administration of water governance the identification of individuals in the archaeological record the management of estates personal handwriting and the uses of personal names additionally the chapter ceramic fabrics and shapes by clementina caputo breaks new ground in the treatment of these inscribed shards as both written text and physical object this volume will be of interest to specialists in roman period egypt as well as to scholars of literacy and writing in the ancient world and elsewhere

the book presents original technologies developed by the authors and existing russian experience in study and application of technogenic raw materials such as burnt rocks of mine dumps and ash slag waste to road constructions with high strength properties and long life operation another direction of the book is connected with finite element modeling pavement constructions on different soils to this aim corresponding theoretical solutions and numerical algorithms are realized in ansys software the obtained numerical results are compared with existing experimental data for real road constituents it presents particular results of the russian schools of mechanics and material sciences not previously available outside of russia explains original theoretical and experimental methods developed for solution of the problems of effective using technogenic waste in building and road constructions facilitates improvement and optimization of theoretical and numerical approaches for road pavements on different soils describes new promising building materials based on easily accessible waste able effectively to replace conventional materials and supported by russian patents

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as a study guide each topic in this manual will be covered in enough detail so that the reader is equipped to complete the part i of the certification exam

this volume presents the stratigraphy and architectural remains of the tell of ancient biblical shechem on the eastern outskirts of the modern municipality of nablus first identified as an ancient ruin and proposed as ancient shechem in 1903 the site was excavated by an austro german team in the period between 1913 and 1934 and by the drew mccormick archaeological expedition later named the joint expedition between 1956 and 1973 now 87 years after ernest sellin began the dig and 27 years after the expedition mounted by g ernest wright left the field this volume sets out to portray this mound of ancient cities that began its history at least 4000 years bce and ended its premodern history in 107 bce

this volume presents an in depth study of the late minoan ia cross draft kiln found in excavations at kommos crete the kiln is of a type

popular during the neopalatial period and its good state of preservation has allowed the authors to speculate about its original internal layout and use as well as about the roof that covered it much of the large quantity of pottery found associated with the kiln is analyzed in detail allowing for the first time the study of the shapes decoration and technical characteristics of vases known to have been fired in a specific Minoan kiln the book presents an integrated program of analytical techniques used to illustrate the range of firing temperatures the compositional similarities and differences in the clays used and aspects of the firing process and the upper kiln structure offered here is a valuable contribution to our knowledge of the technology and organization of ceramic production at the beginning of the late Minoan period which will form a basis for studies of pottery provenience and exchange

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this is the final publication of the persian and hellenistic pottery from the american joint expedition to shechem 1956 1968 since these were the last periods of occupation of the site most of the pottery comes from the early seasons especially 1956 1957 1960 and 1962 the later strata were defined by these excavations as early persian stratum v and early hellenistic to late hellenistic strata iv i this volume presents the complete pottery corpus of these periods from shechem in an introductory chapter the stratification and important loci for this study are described the next two chapters present the pottery from the persian and hellenistic pottery by type with reference to strata and loci complete with drawings descriptions and comparative material from other sites a final chapter summarizes the important typological features and appendixes list loci with descriptions and finds from them

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
