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meaning in interaction an introduction to pragmatics is a comprehensive introductory text which discusses the development of pragmatics its aims and methodology and also introduces themes that are not generally covered in other texts jenny thomas focuses on the dynamic nature of speaker meaning considering the central roles of both speaker and hearer and takes into account the social and psychological factors involved in the generation and interpretation of utterances the book includes a detailed examination of the development of pragmatics as a discipline drawing attention to problems encountered in earlier work and brings the reader up to date with recent discussion in the field the book is written principally for students with no previous knowledge of pragmatics and the basic concepts are covered in considerable detail theoretical and more complicated information is highlighted with examples that have been drawn from the media fiction and real life interaction and makes the study more accessible to newcomers it is an ideal introductory textbook for students of linguistics and for all who are interested in analysing problems in communication

this volume offers the reader a singular overview of current thinking on indirect reports the contributors are eminent researchers from the fields of philosophy of language theoretical linguistics and communication theory who answer questions on this important issue this exciting area of controversy has until now mostly been treated from the viewpoint of philosophy this volume adds the views from semantics conversation analysis and sociolinguistics authors address matters such as the issue of semantic minimalism vs radical contextualism the attribution of responsibility for the modes of presentation associated with noun phrases and how to distinguish the indirect reporter's responsibility from the original speaker's responsibility they also explore the connection between indirect reporting and direct quoting clearly indirect reporting has some bearing on the semantics pragmatics debate however there is much controversy on what is said whether this is a minimal semantic logical form enriched by saturating pronominals or a much richer and fully contextualized logical form this issue will be discussed from several angles many of the authors are contextualists and the discussion brings out the need to take context into account when one deals with indirect reports both the context of the original utterance and the context of the report it is interesting to see how rich cues and clues can radically transform the reported message assigning illocutionary force and how they can be mobilized to distinguish several voices in the utterance decoupling the voice of the reporting speaker from that of the reported speaker on the basis of rich contextual clues is an important issue that pragmatic theory has to tackle articles on the issue of slurs will bring new light to the issue of decoupling responsibility in indirect reporting while others are theoretically oriented and deal with deep problems in philosophy and epistemology

an introduction to the linguistic study of meaning this book outlines the meaning potential semantics of english and how

language knowledge is put to use pragmatics as well as gaining a systematic overview of meaning in english readers can learn how to argue for analyses among the significant concepts introduced are denotation sense relations event types explicature implicature presupposition metaphor reference speech acts and at an elementary level generalised quantifier theory sense relations such as antonymy and hyponymy are presented as summarising patterns of entailment the sense of a word is seen as the contributions it makes to the entailments carried by sentences

over the years pragmatics the study of the use and meaning of utterances to their situations has become a more and more important branch of linguistics as the inadequacies of a purely formalist abstract approach to the study of language have become more evident this book presents a rhetorical model of pragmatics that is a model which studies linguistic communication in terms of communicative goals and principles of good communicative behaviour in this respect geoffrey leech argues for a rapprochement between linguistics and the traditional discipline of rhetoric he does not reject the chomskyan revolution of linguistics but rather maintains that the language system in the abstract i e the grammar broadly in chomsky's sense must be studied in relation to a fully developed theory of language use there is therefore a division of labour between grammar and rhetoric or in the study of meaning between semantics and pragmatics the book's main focus is thus on the development of a model of pragmatics within an overall functional model of language in this it builds on the speech act theory of austin and searle and the theory of conversational implicature of grice but at the same time enlarges pragmatics to include politeness irony phatic communion and other social principles of linguistic behaviour
