gee joan if only you were french and male and dead new york art dealer to joan mitchell the 1950s she was a steel heiress from the midwest chicago and lake forest her grandfather built chicago s bridges and worked for andrew carnegie she was a daughter of the american revolution anglo saxon republican episcopalian she was tough disciplined courageous dazzling and went up against the masculine art world at its most entrenched made her way in it and disproved their notion that women couldn t paint joan mitchell is the first full scale biography of the abstract expressionist painter who came of age in the 1950s 60s and 70s a portrait of an outrageous artist and her struggling artist world painters making their way in the second part of america s twentieth century as a young girl she was a champion figure skater and though she lacked balance and

coordination accomplished one athletic triumph after another until giving up competitive skating to become a painter mitchell saw people and things in color color and emotion were the same to her she said i use the past to make my pictures and i want all of it and even you and me in candlelight on the train and every lover i've ever had every friend nothing closed out it's all part of me and i want to confront it and sleep with it the dreams and paint it her work had an unerring sense of formal rectitude daring and discipline as well as delicacy grace and awkwardness mitchell exuded a young smoky tough glamour and was thought of as sexy as hell albers writes about how mitchell married her girlhood pal barnet rosset jr scion of a financier who was head of chicago's metropolitan trust and partner of jimmy roosevelt rosset went on to buy grove press in 1951 at mitchell's urging and to publish henry miller samuel beckett jean genet jack kerouac allen ginsberg et al making grove into the great avant garde publishing house of its time mitchell's life was messy and reckless in new york and east hampton carousing with de kooning frank o'hara james schuyler jane freilicher franz kline helen frankenthaler and others going to clambakes cocktail parties softball games and living an entirely different existence in paris and vétheuil mitchell's inner life embraced a world beyond her own craft especially literature her compositions were informed by imagined landscapes or feelings about places in joan mitchell patricia albers brilliantly reconstructs the painter's large and impassioned life her growing prominence as an artist her marriage and affairs her friendships with poets and painters her extraordinary work joan mitchell re-creates the times the people and her worlds from the 1920s through the 1990s and brings it all spectacularly to life

this book covers the entire historical range of the sioux from their emergence as an identifiable group in late prehistory to the year 2000 the author has studied the material remains of the sioux for many years his expertise combined with his informative and engaging writing style and numerous photographs create a compelling and indispensable book a leading expert discusses and analyzes the sioux people with rigorous scholarship and remarkably clear writing raises questions about sioux history while synthesizing the historical and anthropological research over a wide scope of issues and periods provides historical sketches topical debates and imaginary reconstructions to engage the reader in a deeper thinking about the sioux includes dozens of photographs comprehensive endnotes and further reading lists

the photographers discussed in this book probe the most contentious aspects of social organization in mexico questioning what it means to belong to be mexican to experience modernity and to create art as a culturally politically or racially marginalized person by choosing human subjects spaces and aesthetics excluded from the lettered city each of the photographers discussed in this volume produces a corpus of art that contests dominant narratives of social and cultural modernization in mexico taken together their work represents diverging and diverse notions of what is meant by mexican modernity the book will be of interest to scholars working in art history history of photography women's studies and mexican studies

during the westward expansion of america white middle class ideals of home and domestic work were used to measure differences between white and native american women yet the vision of america as home was more than a metaphor for women s stake in the process of conquest it took deliberate work to create and uphold treating white and indigenous women s struggles as part of the same history jane e simonsen argues that as both cultural workers and domestic laborers insisted upon the value of their work to civilization they exposed the inequalities integral to both the nation and the household simonsen illuminates discussions about the value of women s work through analysis of texts and images created by writers women s rights activists reformers anthropologists photographers field matrons and native american women she argues that women such as caroline soule alice fletcher e jane gay anna dawson wilde and angel decora called upon the rhetoric of sentimental domesticity ethnographic science public display and indigenous knowledge as they sought to make the gendered and racial order of the nation visible through homes and the work performed in them focusing on the range of materials through which domesticity was produced in the west simonsen integrates new voices into the study of domesticity s imperial manifestations

over 15 years ago kim anderson set out to explore how indigenous womanhood had been constructed and reconstructed in canada weaving her own journey as a cree métis woman with the insights knowledge and stories of the forty indigenous women she interviewed the result was a recognition of being a powerful work that identified both the painful legacy of colonialism and the vital potential of self definition in this second edition anderson revisits her groundbreaking text to include recent literature on indigenous feminism and two spirited theory and to document the efforts of indigenous women to resist heteropatriarchy beginning with a look at the positions of women in traditional indigenous societies and their status after colonization this text shows how indigenous women have since resisted imposed roles reclaimed their traditions and reconstructed a powerful native womanhood featuring a new foreword by maria campbell and an updated closing dialogue with bonita lawrence this revised edition will be a vital text for courses in women and gender studies and indigenous studies as well as an important resource for anyone committed to the process of decolonization

this book provides a thorough and engaging study of plains indian life it covers both historical and contemporary aspects and contains wide and balanced treatment of the many different tribal groups including canadian and southern populations daniel j gelo draws on years of ethnographic research and emphasizes that plains societies and cultures are continuing living entities the second edition has been updated to take account of recent developments and current terminology the chapters feature a range of illustrations maps and text boxes as well as summaries key terms and questions to support teaching and learning it is an essential text for courses on indians of the great plains and relevant for students of anthropology archaeology history and indigenous studies
