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originally published in english in 1988 joseph ratzinger s eschatology remains internationally recognized as a leading text on the last things heaven and hell purgatory and judgment death and the immortality of the soul this highly anticipated second edition includes a new preface by joseph ratzinger pope benedict xvi and a supplement to the bibliography by theologian peter a casarella eschatology presents a balanced perspective of the doctrine at the center of christian belief the church s faith in eternal life recognizing the task of contemporary eschatology as to marry perspectives

so that person and community present and future are seen in their unity joseph ratzinger brings together recent emphasis on the theology of hope for the future with the more traditional elements of the doctrine his book has proven to be as timeless as it is timely

thomas rausch sj approaches his latest book with the conviction that one cant write about eschatology without also addressing issues involving christology soteriology the mission of the church and the liturgy he faces squarely the question of what eschatology suggests about our salvation both now and in the world to come

eschatology is the study of the last things death judgment the afterlife and the end of the world through centuries of christian thought from the early church fathers through the middle ages and the reformation these issues were of the utmost importance in other religions too eschatological concerns were central after the enlightenment though many religious thinkers began to downplay the importance of eschatology which in light of rationalism came to be seen as something of an embarrassment the twentieth century however saw the rise of phenomena that placed eschatology back at the forefront of religious thought from the rapid expansion of fundamentalist forms of christianity with their focus on the end times to the proliferation of apocalyptic new religious movements to the recent and very public debates about suicide martyrdom and paradise in islam interest in eschatology is once again on the rise in addition to its popular resurgence in recent years some of the worlds most important theologians have returned eschatology to its former position of prominence the oxford handbook of eschatology will provide an important critical survey of this diverse body of thought and practice from a variety of perspectives biblical historical theological philosophical and cultural this volume will be the primary resource for students scholars and others interested in questions of our ultimate existence

in hope and otherness jakob wirén analyses the place and role of the religious other in contemporary eschatology in connection with this theme he examines and compares different levels of inclusion and exclusion in christian muslim and jewish eschatologies he argues that a distinction should be made in approaches to this issue between soteriological openness and eschatological openness by going beyond christian theology and also looking to muslim and jewish sources and by combining the question of the religious other with eschatology wirén explores ways of articulating christian

a living sacrifice focuses on the inherent relationship between eschatology and the liturgy in light of ratzinger s insistence upon the primacy of logos over ethos when logos is subordinated to ethos the human person becomes subjected to a materialist ontology that leads to an ethos that is concerned above all by utility and progress which affects one s approach to understanding the liturgy and eschatology how a person celebrates the liturgy becomes subject to the individual whim of one person or a group of people eschatology is reduced to addressing the temporal needs of a society guided by a narrow conception of hope or political theology if the human person wants to understand his authentic sacramental logos then he must first turn to christ the incarnate logos who reveals to him that he is created for a loving relationship with god and others the primacy of logos is the central hermeneutical key to understanding the unique vision of ratzinger s christocentric liturgical

theology and eschatology this is coupled with a study of ratzinger's spiritual christology with a focus on how it influences his theology of liturgy and eschatology through the notions of participation and communion in christ's sacrificial love finally a living sacrifice examines ratzinger's theology of hope charity and beauty as well as his understanding of active participation in relationship to the eschatological and cosmic characteristics of the sacred liturgy

both alexander schmemmann and joseph ratzinger insist that the human person remains shrouded in mystery without god's self disclosure in the person of jesus christ like us jesus lived in a particular time and location and therefore time and temporality must be part of the ontological question of what it means to be a human person yet jesus the one who has time for us ascended to the father and the bride of christ awaits his return and therefore time and temporality are conditioned by the eschatological with this in mind the ontological question of personhood and temporality is a question that concerns eschatology how does eschatology shape personhood bringing together schmemmann and ratzinger in a theological dialogue for the first time this book explores their respective approaches and answers to the aforementioned question while the two theologians share much in common it is only ratzinger's relational ontological approach that by being consistently relational from top to bottom consistently preserves the meaningfulness of temporal existence

christians look with hope to the resurrection of the dead and the restoration of all things but what of those who have already died do they also await these things or have they in some sense already happened for them within the catholic theological community this question has traditionally been answered in terms of the disembodied souls of human beings awaiting bodily resurrection since the 1960s catholic theologians have proposed two alternatives resurrection at death into the last day and the consummation of all things or resurrection in death into an interim state in which the embodied dead await with us the final consummation of all things this book critically examines the scriptural philosophical and theological reasons for these alternatives and on the basis of this analysis offers an account of the traditional schema which makes clear that in spite of these challenges it remains the preferable option
