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tourism is the fourth biggest industry in the world what are the key concepts in tourist studies this essential resource for students of tourism contains concise and authoritative entries on planning tourism sustainable tourism festivals and events cultural tourism economics of tourism regeneration the experience economy urban tourism sex tourism shrewdly judged to suit the needs of the modern student the book offers the basic materials tools and guidance for making sense of tourism and gaining the best results in essays and exams

how do we re theorize tourism by drawing less on the foucauldian notion of tourism as gazing and instead focusing on the social construction of meaning in the landscape this insightful book provides an innovative and compelling new approach to tourist studies arguing that in any view of the landscape and in tourism generally there is a multiplicity of insider and outsider meanings the book grounds tourism studies within the framework of social theory and particularly in the social theoretic approaches to landscape bringing together specialists in tourism and landscape studies to discuss the relationships between the two it finds that issues of identity are a common thread and are raised with regard to the social construction of landscape and its portrayal through tourism the international studies range in scale from regional to national personal to political and from local residents to international tourists highlighting the multiplicity of interpretations and meanings between these scales

in 1982 when my book the social psychology of tourist behaviour was published it was almost possible to review academic research on tourism in 1988 in a book of similar scale such a review is almost impossible the aim of the present volume is therefore to outline a body of work which adopts a consistent theme and method in exploring the topic of tourism the approach is one of emphasising tourists reactions and behaviours the work is both behavioural and cognitive and stems principally from applied traditions in social and environmental psychology the examples of tourist studies tend to be australian british and north american principally because work elsewhere in psychological studies of tourists is less well organised the nationality of the researchers should not however confine the application of the research findings since while the examples may be specific the results are applicable in brisbane boggorr or bogota the book is intended not just for academic tourism researchers but also for all psychologists so that they might note an understudied phenomenon within their discipline for leisure researchers it is hoped that it will provide an opportunity for them to see developments parallel to their own research efforts in studying recreational behaviour is it also a volume for tourism managers and executives in part it is and the sections such readers might find of particular interest are chapters 1 2 3 and 9

over the past decade tourism studies has broken out of its traditional institutional affiliation with business and management programs to take its legitimate place as an

interdisciplinary social science field of cutting edge scholarship the field has emerged as central to ongoing debates in social theory concerning such diverse topics as postcolonialism mobility and postmodernism to name just a few while there has been a diverse body of empirical research on this transformation the theoretical discussions in tourism studies remain largely attached to theories of modernity and anglo centric assumptions about tourism there is a need for the field to come to terms theoretically with the contemporary and future realities of tourism as a truly global phenomenon real tourism is a significant volume which sets this new theoretical agenda engaging directly with what tourism does in practice and in place and demonstrates the need for a theoretical intervention that moves tourism scholarship beyond the province of anglophone thinking the volume achieves this by explicitly bridging western and non western scholarship on tourism reframing theoretical discussions around real practices instead of abstract typologies and radically delinking tourism theory from the grand narratives of modernity and assumptions about authenticity identity tradition and development the book brings together leading academics in the field and provides provocative multidisciplinary and multi contextual reflection on the future of tourism this original timely and compelling volume puts forward new post modernist ideas and arguments about tourism today and in the future it is essential reading for students researchers and academics interested in tourism
