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this book addresses the topic of interactional competence in the area of learning japanese as a second language it presents data collected from learners studying abroad in japan to explain developments in their interactional competence as found in their use of speech styles and co construction of an utterance

local language testing design implementation and development describes the language testing practice that exists in the intermediate space between large scale standardized testing and classroom assessment an area that is rarely addressed in the language testing and assessment literature covering both theory and practice the book focuses on the advantages of local tests fosters and encourages their use and provides suggested ideas for their development and maintenance the authors include examples of operational tests with well proven track records and discuss the ability of local tests to represent local contexts and values explicitly and purposefully embed test results within instructional practice and provide data for program evaluation and research local testing practices grounded in the theoretical principles of language testing drawing from experiences with local testing and providing practical examples of local language tests illustrating how they can be designed to effectively function within and across different institutional contexts examples of how local language tests and assessments are developed for use within a specific context and how they serve a variety of purposes e g entry level

proficiency testing placement testing international teaching assistant testing writing assessment and program evaluation aimed at language program directors graduate students and researchers involved in language program development and evaluation this is a timely book in that it focuses on the advantages of local tests fosters and encourages their use and outlines their development and maintenance it constitutes essential reading for language program directors graduate students and researchers involved in language program development and evaluation

focuses for the first time on materials development and applications of current research and theory for the main areas of applied linguistics e g second language acquisition pragmatics vocabulary studies there are many books on applied linguistic theory and research and there are now a number of books on the principled development of materials for language learning but this book takes a new approach by connecting the two concerns each of its chapters first of all presents relevant theories and research conclusions for its area and then considers practical applications for materials development the chapters achieve these applications by reporting and commenting on current theory and research by analysing the match between current published materials and current theory and by suggesting and exemplifying applications of current theory to materials development this will be an essential resource both for those studying or teaching materials development and for those studying or teaching applied linguistics

the routledge handbook of pragmatics provides a state of the art overview of the wide breadth of research in pragmatics an introductory section outlines a brief history the main issues and key approaches and perspectives in the field followed by a thought provoking introductory chapter on interdisciplinarity by jacob l mey a further thirty eight chapters cover both traditional and newer areas of pragmatic research divided into four sections methods and modalities established fields pragmatics across disciplines applications of pragmatic research in today s world with accessible refreshing descriptions and discussions and with a look towards future directions this handbook is an essential resource for advanced undergraduates postgraduates and researchers in pragmatics within english language and linguistics and communication studies

this edited volume addresses issues that promote the notion of classroom based language assessment cbla for the academic community and beyond the book explores recent thinking and research on cbla within the fields of language testing assessment and general education based on theoretical and research papers presented at the recent cbla sig ealta symposia held in cyprus and the pre conference ealta workshops in various countries around europe the volume contains 17 chapters which involve both high stakes tests and classroom based assessments conducted by academics professionals and researchers in the field it brings together high quality submissions that cover a gap in a research area that has long been in need of theoretical and empirical attention overall this edited collection with its international scope offers a ground breaking resource bringing together in balanced relationship the fields of education and second language testing and assessment

second language assessment is ubiquitous it has found its way from education into questions about access to professions and migration this volume focuses on the main debates and research advances in second language assessment in the last fifty years or so showing the influence of linguistics politics philosophy psychology sociology and psychometrics there are four parts which when taken together address the principles and practices of second language assessment while considering its impact on society read separately each part addresses a different aspect of the field part i deals with the conceptual foundations of second language assessment with chapters on the purposes of assessment and standards and frameworks as well as matters of scoring quality assurance and test validation part ii addresses the theory and practice of assessing different second language skills including aspects like intercultural competence and fluency part iii examines the challenges and opportunities of second language assessment in a range of contexts in addition to chapters on second language assessment on a national scale there are chapters on learning oriented assessment as well as the uses of second language assessment in the workplace and for migration part iv examines a selection of important issues in the field that deserve attention these include the alignment of language examinations to external frameworks the increasing use of technology to both deliver and score second language tests the responsibilities associated with assessing test takers with special needs the concept of voice in

second language assessment and assessment literacy for teachers and other test and score users

this book provides the first comprehensive overview of young children s language learning in pre primary and primary education it collates research to date on language development and pedagogy among children learning a language in addition to their home language s in instructional settings providing readers with a thorough understanding of the topic and directions for further study the book promotes a learner centered approach to research and teaching and encourages critical reflection on how best to conduct research among children it recognizes the substantial diversity of young language learning experiences and pays attention to individual differences and variability in children s language development embracing an ecological perspective sensitive to contextual factors closing the gap between research and practice each chapter opens with pedagogical or policy related questions explores relevant theories and research findings from instructed second language acquisition and offers discussion questions and recommended reading for further reflection and study this will be invaluable reading for all those who are undertaking research and working with young language learners

this book reports on a longitudinal study of the acquisition of pragmatic markers in written discourse in a third language english by secondary students living in the bilingual spanish and catalan valencian community in spain it examines pragmatic transfer specifically positive transfer in multilingual students from a holistic perspective taking into account their linguistic repertoire and using ecologically valid classroom writing tasks in a longitudinal study it tackles the issue of task based language teaching from a multilingual perspective by presenting a study which takes place in natural classroom contexts where real classroom tasks are used to explore the interaction between languages in multilinguals the book combines a focus on multilingual language development and pragmatics and discusses the resources multilingual learners take to the classroom
