le corbusier 1887 1965 was the most significant architect of the twentieth century every architecture student examines the swiss master s work yet all too frequently they rely on reproductions of faded drawings of uneven size and quality le corbusier redrawn presents the only collection of consistently rendered original drawings at 1 200 scale of all twenty six of le corbusier s

residential works using the original drawings from the le corbusier foundation's digital archives architect steven park has beautifully redrawn 130 perspectival sections as well as plans sections and elevations of exterior forms and interior spaces these remarkable new drawings which combine the conceptual clarity of the section with the spatial qualities of the perspective not only provide information about the buildings they also help students experience specific works spatially as they learn to critically examine le corbusier's works

in 1929 eileen gray designed villa e 1027 for herself and her youthful partner jean badovici but only lived there for three years today the elegant house in roquebrune cap mar tin in southern france is an icon of modernism in 1937 le corbusier discovered the place and the maison en bord de mer inspired by the genius of the place and the light on the côte d azur he created a total of eight large format wall paintings there in 1938 and 1939 onwards some of which complement the building congenially while others set counterpoints in 1952 he built his cabanon nearby and decorated it with murals as well the book by the well known architectural historian tim benton documents le corbusier's artwork at this special place explores its controversies and places it in his overall oeuvre the fascinating photographs by manuel bougot capture the special atmosphere of the villa le corbusier's painting is lesser known but was formative for his lifelong preoccupation with polychromy after extensive renovation work until 2021 e 1027 as well as the cabanon is open to the public again

the millowners association building in ahmedabad designed by le corbusier and completed in 1954 has rarely been published but is nevertheless considered an important milestone in the architect's work in particular the building influenced his later work such as the carpenter center for the visual arts at harvard this book documents the building and relates it to le corbusier's theoretical work especially *vers une architecture* the significance of key figures such as paul valéry and john ruskin for le corbusier's work is explained characteristic design elements such as the promenade architecturale and the use of brise soleils are explored in addition to numerous scaled drawings newly produced models clarify the most important design aspects of the building le corbusier's 1954 building for the millowners association in ahmedabad is an understudied key work with attractive photographs new drawings and models created especially for the publication the structure exemplifies characteristic elements of le corbusier's work and his development as an architect

charles edouard jeanneret set about the task of reinventing everything he had touched from himself to architecture famously he began with his own name his resonant pseudonym le corbusier meant crow like and he spent most of his career observing the wide horizon of worldwide developments
