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aesthetics in a multicultural age examines a variety of significant multidisciplinary and multicultural topics within the subject of aesthetics addressing the vexed relation of the arts and criticism to current political and cultural concerns the contributors to this volume attempt to bridge the two decades old gap

between scholars and critics who hold conflicting views of the purposes of art and criticism by exploring some of the ways in which global migration and expanding ethnic diversity are affecting cultural productions and prompting reassessment of the nature and role of aesthetic discourse this volume provides a new evaluation of aesthetic ideas and practices within contemporary arts and letters

when in 1735 alexander gottlieb baumgarten added a new discipline to the philosophical system he not only founded modern aesthetics but also contributed to shaping the modern concept of art or fine art in the founding of aesthetics in the german enlightenment stefanie buchenau offers a rich analysis and reconstruction of the origins of this new discipline in its wider context of german enlightenment philosophy present day scholars commonly regard baumgarten s views as an imperfect prefiguration of kantian and post kantian aesthetics but buchenau argues that baumgarten defended a consistent and original project which must be viewed in the context of the modern debate on the art of invention her book offers new perspectives on kantian aesthetics and beauty in art and science

this is an investigation of arts and aesthetics in their widest senses and experiences presenting a variety of perspectives which range from the metaphysical to the political moving beyond art as an expression of the inner mind and invention of the individual self the volume bridges the gap between changing perceptions of contemporary art and aesthetics and maps globalizing currents in a number of contexts and regions the volume includes an impressive variety of case studies offered by established leaders in the field and original and emerging scholarly talent covering areas in india nepal indonesia iran russia rwanda and germany as well as providing transnational or diasporic perspectives from the contradictory demands made on successful artists from the south in the global art world such as anish Kapoor to images of war and puppetry created by female political prisoners the volume compels creative and political interpretations of the ever changing and globalizing terrain of arts and aesthetics

vernacular aesthetics in the later middle ages explores the formal composition public performance and popular reception of vernacular poetry music and prose within late medieval french and english cultures this collection of essays considers the extra literary and extra textual methods by which vernacular forms and genres were obtained and examines the roles that performance and orality play in the reception and dissemination of those genres arguing that late medieval vernacular forms can be used to delineate the interests and perspectives of the subaltern via an interdisciplinary approach contributors use theories of multimodality translation manuscript studies sound studies gender studies and activist new formalism to address how and for whom popular vernacular medieval forms were made

this book examines aesthetic issues based on humanities principles and creates a theory of chinese aesthetics from a global perspective by applying china s traditional and cultural history to a western theoretical framework in particular this book emphasizes the shared features of confucianism daoism and buddhism namely the unity of heaven and men unity of nature and society and the materialization of human feelings and humanization of material things it also highlights the dominant role of humans in the aesthetic relationship between human and object while placing imagery in a focal position

seeks to bring present day philosophy principles into the history of aesthetics before the publication of aesthetics from classical greece to the present there were three histories of aesthetics in english bosanquet s pioneering work the second part of croce s aesthetic in the ainsle translation and the comprehensive volume by gilbert and kuhn while each of these is interesting in its own ways and together they cover a good deal of ground none of them is very new thus none could take advantage of recent work on many important philosophers and periods and bring into a consideration of the past the best concepts and principles that have been developed by present day philosophy
