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this book helps you understand what mastery is and how to effectively integrate it into classroom teaching it explores how mastery is viewed and supported in other countries and encourages a critical examination of this topical theme the book includes practical advice and examples of learning activities for primary teaching it also outlines how to support children who might be weaker in their mathematical abilities and still ensure that all children master mathematics the text

also supports those who are developing whole school mastery approaches and looks at how we can assess mastery as well as how we can be confident that it is supporting good progress
