federico garcía lorca 1898 1938 is often thought of as a fine lyric poet of the 1920s who then developed into one of spain s greatest playwrights 1931 36 but other aspects of lorca s literary career are equally significant the earlier theatrical pieces which he had started writing by 1918 the bold experimental expressionist plays of 1930 31 and the subject of this volume the later poetry written as his powers as a dramatist matured in the 1930s professor anderson s book is the first in any language to focus specifically on lorca s poetic output from 1931 to 1936 it offers extensive detailed analyses of all the poetry composed during that period *diván del tamarit* with its arab andalusian flavour and stylization the *llanto por ignacio sánchez mejías* a sustained lament on the death of a bullfighter friend *seis poemas galegos* and *sonetos* love poetry echoing petrarch shakespeare and góngora four collections equal or superior in quality power and suggestiveness to lorca s canonic poetical works adopting a literary critical approach based on the close reading of individual texts with relevant background information professor anderson elaborates on the themes and techniques imagery and symbolism strengths and weaknesses of each poem in the four collections thereby he can relate this corpus to the whole of lorca s work showing that it cannot be neatly categorized under any of the avant garde isms prevalent in the 1920s and 1930s his

arguments for a revised appraisal of lorca's creative development lead to a compelling case for a re-evaluation of his late poetry an appendix gives english translations of all the poems under discussion other spanish quotations are translated in the text and there is a fifteen page bibliography of primary and secondary material

federico garcía lorca spain's greatest modern poet and dramatist was murdered by fascist partisans in 1936 shortly after the outbreak of the spanish civil war he was by then an immensely popular figure celebrated throughout the spanish speaking world and at the height of his creative powers after his death with his work suppressed he became a potent symbol of the martyrdom of spain the manuscript of lorca's last poems his tormented sonnets of dark love disappeared during the civil war for fifty years the poems lived only in the words of the poets who had heard lorca read them like neruda and alexandre who remembered them as a pure and ardent monument to love in which the prime material is now the poet's flesh his heart his soul wide open to his own destruction lorca's lost sonnets were re-discovered in spain during the 1980s and merryn williams's edition of his selected poems was the first to include english translations of these brooding poems merryn williams edition draws on the full range of lorca's poetry from the early poems and the gypsy ballads to the agitated poet in new york sequence and the arab influenced gacelas and casidas which followed his american exile it includes the lament for ignacio sánchez mejías lorca's great elegy for his bullfighter friend as well as the full text of his famous lecture on the duende the daemon of spanish music song dance poetry and art in these remarkable translations lorca's elemental poems are reborn in english with their stark images of blood and moon of water and earth of bulls horses and fish olives sun and oranges knives and snow darkness and death

the passionate life and violent death of federico garcia lorca 1898 1936 retain an enduring fascination for readers around the world murdered by nationalists at the outset of the spanish civil war lorca died at the peak of his creative powers he remains his country s most widely translated writer surpassed only by cervantes in terms of critical commentary this selection includes 55 of the 68 poems that comprised lorca s 1921 libro de poemas all of them in their entirety and in their original sequence imbued with the spirit and folklore of the poet s native andalusia these verses feature the most complex spiritual content of any of lorca s works editor stanley appelbaum provides sensitive accurate english translations on the pages facing the original spanish as well as an informative introduction to the author s life and oeuvre plus notes on the individual poems an outstanding resource for students and teachers of spanish language and literature this compilation will enchant any lover of poetry

days of the spanish civil war here too are several lyrics translated into english for the first time and the play blood wedding also a great tragic poem arvio has created a fresh voice for lorca in english full of urgency pathos and lyricism showing the poet s work has grown only more beautiful with the passage of time

the selected poems of federico garcía lorca has introduced generations of american readers to mesmerizing poetry since 1955 lorca 1898 1937 is admired all over the world for the lyricism immediacy and clarity of his poetry as well as for his ability to encompass techniques of the symbolist movement with deeper psychological shadings but lorca s poems are most of all admired for their beauty undercurrents of his major influences spanish folk traditions from his native andalusia and granada gypsy ballads and his friends the surrealists salvador dali and luis bunuel stream throughout lorca s work poets represented here as translators are as diverse as stephen spender langston hughes ben belitt william jay smith and w s merwin

breathtaking in its versatility lorca s poetry conveys the sense that there are many lorcas but elusive a play of presence and absence for lorca fluidity and evasion are essential to the truth of poetry his deep anguish his performative masques his sense of difference and his identification with those also marginalized his sense of the interpenetration of absence and presence all begin to interconnect if viewed from a queered center these translations seek only the original its deep intelligence where a phrase can convey what lorca called duende an elusive something else that evades all definition a mysterious force that everyone feels and no philosopher has explained the spirit of the earth

the magic of andalusia is crystallized in federico garcia lorca's first major work poem of the deep song written in 1921 when the poet was twenty three years old and published a decade later in this group of poems based on saetas soleares and siguiriyas lorca captures the passionate flamenco cosmos of andalusia's gypsies those mysterious wandering folk who gave deep song its definitive form cante jondo deep song comes from a musical tradition that developed among peoples who fled into the mountains in the 15th century to escape the spanish inquisition with roots in arabic instruments sephardic ritual byzantine liturgy native folk songs and above all the rhythms of gypsy life deep song is characterized by intense and profound emotion fearing that the priceless heritage of deep song might vanish from spain lorca along with manuel de falla and other young artists hoped to preserve the artistic treasure of an entire race in poem of the deep song the poet's own lyric genius gives cante jondo a special kind of immortality carlos baur is the translator of garcia lorca's the public and play without a title two posthumous plays and of cries from a wounded madrid poetry of the spanish civil war he has also translated the work of henry miller and other contemporary american writers into spanish

federico garcia lorca was born in fuente vaqueros in 1898 a poet and dramatist he was also a talented musician he studied in granada and in 1919 went to madrid in 1929 he left spain for new york just after the outbreak of the civil war in 1936 he was shot by nationalist partisans in granada his murder combined with those aspects of his work which correspond to romantic foreign notions about spain helped to establish his poetic reputation abroad this book contains a selection of his poems

lorca's drawings and poems focuses on the act of reading lorca's drawn or written texts and how the reading of one

genre can inform the reading of another throughout the study poetry and drawings from every period of lorca s career are examined selected drawings are interpreted next poems contemporary to those drawings are analyzed in their light in chapter 1 a common poetics is extracted from lorca s comments about his drawings and writing and placed in the context of the literary and artistic movements of his day the evolution of the literary criticism that examines lorca s drawings is traced and reviewed lorca s texts are examined from varying perspectives in the chapters that follow in chapter 2 drawings and poems from 1927 to 1928 are analyzed in light of lorca s participations in artistic and literary movements during those years texts from each period of lorca s work are read in chapter 3 in a study of lorca s employment of space and his depiction of setting and subject in his drawings and poems such a chronological approach allows the reading of lorca s texts to reveal the evolution of his aesthetics as well as to identify the imagery and techniques that remained consistent throughout his career

weaving together twenty one drawings and new translations of prose pieces and poems only mystery presents a textured life of spain s greatest modern poet and playwright the guiding principles for selecting poems prose and paintings were dramatic effect and narrative cohesion originally designed for performance in readers theatre only mystery may be appreciated as both a dramatic text for performance and an illustrated narrative of the poet s lyrical world

a revised edition of this major writer s complete poetical work and i who was walking with the earth at my waist saw two snowy eagles and a naked girl the one was the other and the girl was neither from qasida of the dark doves federico garcía lorca was the most beloved poet of twentieth century spain and one of the world s most influential modernist

writers his work has long been admired for its passionate urgency and haunting evocation of sorrow and loss perhaps more persistently than any writer of his time he sought to understand and accommodate the numinous sources of his inspiration though he died at age thirty eight he left behind a generous body of poetry drama musical arrangements and drawings which continue to surprise and inspire christopher maurer a leading garcía lorca scholar and editor has brought together new and substantially revised translations by twelve poets and translators placed side by side with the spanish originals the seminal volume poet in new york is also included here in its entirety this is the most comprehensive collection in english of a poet who as maurer writes in his illuminating introduction spoke unforgettably of all that most interests us the otherness of nature the demons of personal identity and artistic creation sex childhood and death

written in 1929 1930 when federico garcía lorca was visiting columbia university poet in new york stands as one of the great waste land poems of the 20th century it expresses as betty jean craige writes in this volume a sudden radical estrangement of the poet from his universe an an estrangement graphically delineated in the dissonant violent imagery which the poet derives from the technological world of new york craige here describes through close analysis of the structure style and themes of individual works in poet in new york the chaos into which this world plunges the poet and the process whereby he is able gradually to recover his identity with the regenerative forces of nature her study demonstrates that though seemingly unique in form and motifs poet in new york is integral with lorca s overall poetic achievement

guided by the duende liminal principle of creativity and death lorca represents new york as dystopia cum armageddon ultimately redeemed by the blacks of harlem and the telluric forces unleashed to retake the decadent soulless civilization

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
