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she was a literary treasure and her books will continue to delight for many years to come philip pullman author of his dark materials a beguiling enthralling regency romance from joan aiken the girl from paris is the third and final book in her paget family saga perfect for fans of jane austen and bridgerton longing to flout convention and spread her wings in society ellen paget accepts a position as a governess in paris old family friend benedict masham has long carried a torch for ellen and is naturally stunned when she makes her departure but when family tragedy and a subsequent scandal force ellen to return to london benedict s passion is reignited and he vows to express his love through unwavering help and support ellen will need to use all of her ingenuity and daring to solve the mysteries of the past and present and keep her family safe but will she also find romance in a place she least expected the tale has echoes of both charlotte and emily brontë but the fast moving narrative and thoroughly modern sense of the ambiguities of character are all miss aiken s own guardian joan aiken blends elements of villette george eliot and thomas hardy observer

unfinished austen examines four texts that jane austen left incomplete catharine or the bower 1792 3 lady susan 1795 the watsons 1803 4 and sanditon 1817 none of them published till well after her death since very little in manuscript form survives from the six famous novels these four manuscript texts offer insight into the novelist in the process of creation they also problematize the romance plot prominent in the published novels by presenting this in a nebulous or incipient state that underlines its artificiality these texts sometimes show how the romance plot is inflected by the financial condition in which young marriageable women can find themselves moreover the stories other than catharine have aroused the interest of many later writers including writers for theatre and screen who are eager to complete or to amplify them they may do this through developing the stories to some kind of dénouement perhaps more intriguingly however these texts induce some writers to question the very enterprise of concluding an unfinished text
