such themes as justice and law gift and exchange duty and debt hospitality cosmopolitanism and pardon this interweaving of paul and derrida shows that paul may be read as a thinker who wrestles with real problems that are of concern to anyone who thinks it also shows that derrida far from being the enemy of theological reflection is himself a necessary companion to the thinking of the biblical theologian against the grain of what passes for common wisdom this book argues that both derrida and paul are indispensable guides to a new way of thinking about justice
