this is a book about health policy as well as individual patients and caregivers and how they interact with each other and with the overall health system when treating a patient s illness health expenditures as a percentage of gross domestic product or variations in surgical rates between one city and another seem remote if not irrelevant but they are neither remote nor irrelevant health policy affects the patients we see on a daily basis managed care referral rules determine which specialist will see a patient coverage gaps in the medicare benefit package affects access to care for the elderly understanding health policy hopes to bridge the gap separating the microworld of individual patient care and the macrouniverse of health policy

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education is intimately connected to many of the most important and contentious questions confronting american society from race to jobs to taxes and the competitive pressures of the global economy have only enhanced its significance elementary and secondary schooling has long been the province of state and local governments but when george w bush signed into law the no child left behind act in 2002 it signaled an unprecedented expansion of the federal role in public education this book provides the first balanced in depth analysis of how no child left behind nclb became law patrick mcguinn a political scientist with hands on experience in secondary education explains how this happened despite the country s long history of decentralized school governance and the longstanding opposition of both liberals and conservatives to an active reform oriented federal role in schools his book provides the essential political context for understanding nclb the controversies surrounding its implementation and forthcoming debates over its reauthorization how the struggle to define the federal role in school reform took center stage in debates over the appropriate role of the government in promoting opportunity and social welfare he places the evolution of the federal role in schools within the context of broader institutional ideological and political changes that have swept the nation since the 1965 elementary and secondary education act chronicles the concerns raised by the 1983 report a nation at risk and shows how education became a major campaign issue for both parties in the 1990s mcguinn argues that the emergence of swing issues such as education can facilitate major policy change even as they influence the direction of wider political debates and partisan conflict mcguinn traces the republican shift from seeking to eliminate the u s department of education to embracing federal leadership in school reform then details the negotiations over nclb the forces that shaped its final provisions and

the ways in which the law constitutes a new federal education policy regime against which states have now begun to rebel and that only by understanding the unique dynamics of national education politics will reformers be able to craft a more effective national role in school reform

health policy thinking must change this book explores the fundamental currents and tensions that lie behind recent trends such as shared decision making co production and personalisation these are often discussed in relation to an epidemiological transition but this text argues that they embody a philosophical transition a change in our conceptions of healthcare and of appropriate forms of knowledge and analysis as clinical concerns are increasingly nested within social concerns then policy analysis must engage with the multiple philosophical tensions that are now centre stage this focus on key underlying ideas and tensions in healthcare couldn t have come at a better time with international relevance the book s arguments help fuel a shift away from a delivery model towards a more deliberative model of healthcare
