harm and even death to protect children in time by using case studies which span the past 120 years of modern practices and drawing on the work of leading social theorists of modernity and risk society it provides a new way of thinking about constructions of child abuse as a social problem and child protection as a late modern expert system and experience it proposes new ways of conceptualizing relationships between professionals children at risk and families and deepens our understanding of what effective interventions have to involve
