the aim of this leading textbook is to provide a thorough understanding of the theories approaches and practice of organisational change it critically examines the approaches to change that are on offer indicates their usefulness and drawbacks and sets them within the broad context of organisational life through the use of real life examples

this book provides an original analysis of change management in organizations in the light of wider sociological perspectives and critically examines the theoretical frameworks underpinning many contemporary accounts of organizational change

in recent years there has been an explosion of books on the nature of organisational change and the management skills needed to effectively carry it out many are written by change gurus and management consultants offering quick fixes and metaphor laden business toolkits however much of their advice is banal and under theorized this book redresses this balance by providing an original analysis of change management in organizations in the light of wider sociological perspectives it critically examines the often implicit theoretical frameworks underpinning many contemporary accounts of organizational change and covers subjects including the importance of explicit analysis of theory and context a critique of populist management gurus and quick fix how to solutions under socialized models of change which emphasise structure over human action trenchant analysis of soft hrm solutions the management of culture radical and innovative this book the first to adopt a sociological approach is a much needed challenge to the orthodoxies of change management

change is frequent in healthcare yet change management is often far from perfect this book considers the complexity of change within large organisations explores existing models of change and emphasises the vital role of emotional and cognitive readiness in successful change management despite the plethora of organisational change management approaches used in healthcare the success rate of change in organisations can be as low as 30 percent new thinking about change management is required to improve success in service development improvement and innovation arguing that emotional and cognitive readiness for change requires engagement with the people involved and a thorough understanding of areas of friction and potential challenge this book also delves into the neglected issue of emotion examining emotional labour and emotion and change it investigates how human emotion can be incorporated into change management models alongside and intertwined with cognitive approaches to support effective change using the nhs as a central case study this book incorporates examples of actual change from a range of healthcare settings from

acute to primary care enabling readers to see how change management models can be adapted and utilised in practice this is an essential read for students as future change leaders and practitioners and managers leading and managing change in healthcare

this book explores the technological innovations and management practices of evangelical church religions beginning from the late 19th century the author examines the evangelical church s increasing appropriation of business practices from the secular world as solutions to organizational problems he notes especially the importance of the church growth movement and the formation of church networks particular attention is paid to the history of evangelical uses of computer technology including connections the christian right has made within silicon valley most significantly this book offers one of the first academic explorations of the use of cybernetics systems theory and complexity theory by evangelical leaders and management theorists

this research study seeks to understand the nature of organisational change with respect to offshore outsourcing of information technology services in a multinational pharmaceutical company and to examine the effectiveness of approaches used to manage this change so that lessons may be drawn from these experiences despite the abundant literature on effective organisational change management the key factors that need to be managed properly at different stages of the offshore outsourcing process are not well understood the research adopts a processual view to paint a broad picture of the issues involved in these different stages a generic process model of change based on the review of the change literature was first developed to represent how change was intended to occur this model focuses on the following four stages in the change process context diagnosis and planning implementation and institutionalisation the research employs an interpretive case study approach and draws on fieldwork from three independent information systems departments cases of the company where offshore outsourcing programmes were implemented qualitative data from semi structured interviews direct observation and document analysis are analysed by applying the generic process model to produce a detailed account of the way in which change was managed in the case organisations the findings reveal that a combination of contextual factors both external and internal to the company influenced the adoption and use of offshore

outsourcing in the case organisations externally the economic forces were found to be the main catalyst for the change while internally the role of the executive leadership and the lack of internal resources further explain the motivations behind the adoption of offshore outsourcing the study illustrates that achieving successful outcomes from offshore outsourcing activities critically depends on the organisation adequately addressing a number of factors such as conveying a sense of urgency developing and communicating the vision identifying the benefits of change and how they will be delivered generating short term wins providing education and training developing a fit between the change and organisational culture etc throughout the change process the findings also highlight the effects of offshore outsourcing on the case organisations including change in job roles and responsibilities and organisational learning activities that enable corrective actions to improve change management efforts an important contribution of this research is the development of a model providing a more comprehensive understanding of the change process associated with the implementation of offshore it outsourcing recommendations for policy makers and change managers to improve change management practice based on the research findings as well as recommendations for further research form a significant part of the conclusions

despite the plethora of books on change there appears is a notable gap in the field rarely is the authentic and candid voice of change practitioners heard seldom are those most closely involved in the management of change given or seek the opportunity to write about their personal experiences and reflexiveness nor is this just a case of practicing managers not being given a voice or feeling that they cannot be frank and open about what they do how often do academics candidly state what they actually do when they are faced with managing change in their own institutions or when they are called on in a consultancy capacity similarly it is rare for full time consultants to be candid about what it is they actually do instead they tend to have a well honed sales pitch which lays out a logical change process directed at helping the client to achieve success yet when academics consultants and practicing managers are prepared to speak candidly about what they really do a richer messier but more illuminating picture of change emerges the aim of perspectives on change is to move beyond the do as i say approach of most change books and to encourage academics consultants and managers to say candidly what it is they really do and what they really think about change and how it should be managed the editors of this book burnes and randall have over 60 years of experience between them of studying and teaching change management acting as consultants and actually managing change projects they are therefore well aware of the differences and contradictions between what academics consultants and managers say about change in public and what they say in private and do in practice perspectives on change will offer students and practitioners of change a unique opportunity to understand change in practice in addition it will also contribute to the rigour relevance debate by giving a
