scientific methodologies the ten articles in this book illuminate a wide range of topics of interest to geography education in their article skarstein and wolff discuss how the interplay between the environment society and economy pillars of sustainability thinking play out on scales of time space and multitude and how geography teachers can support the students understanding of sustainability yli panula et al analysed used teaching and learning methods to find out good ones for promoting sustainability in geography the same idea can be found in duffin s and perry s article on place based ecology education in their article dür and keller discuss the topics of quality of life sustainability and global justice based on the goals of education for sustainable development evaluation is an important part of learning it is reviewed by schauss and sprenger regarding climate change education the following two articles deal with students views of landscapes worth conserving in both studies students expressed concern about the state of the environment yli panula et al found that the mexican students seldom considered their own activities in relation to the environment while yli panula et al stated that only some of the finnish and swedish students act as observers while others actively care for their environment the remaining three articles deal with teaching methods and models benninghaus et al present a benchmark method which allows statements about the quality of the maps diagrams in general Álvarez otero and de lázaro y torres on the other hand describe their technological pedagogical content knowledge model kopnina and saari discusses student assignments reflecting on the documentary film through critical pedagogy and ecopedagogy

this volume presents papers in honour of tony james wilkinson who was professor of archaeology at durham university from 2006 until his death in 2014 though commemorative in concept the volume is an assemblage of new research representing emerging agendas and innovative methods in remote sensing and their application in near eastern archaeology

this study seeks insights into the peoples and traditions of the tanzanian coast east africa during the 6th to 15th century through the application of archaeological survey and excavation techniques in the vicinity of the two important trading centres of kaole and kilwa it adopts a maritime cultural landscape perspective an approach that has seen very limited previous application to the east african coast despite the central role played by the sea in the development of its port settlements and exploitation of its resources six themes are covered namely the identification of coastal settlement sites and establishment of their chronology recognition of principal phases in settlement development exploitation of maritime resources and economy identification of settlement location in relationship to the physical environment of the coast establishment of the hierarchical nature of coastal settlement and recognition of the principal harbour and port types

children live their lives across various social settings including homes kindergartens schools and different kinds of institutions the different contributions of this book focus on children s perspectives and on how children learn and develop through taking part in activities in social communities such as families peer groups classrooms and day care institutions this collection illustrate different ways of dealing with varying social contexts and the research presented involves questions about children s world making anchored in children s daily lives the studies are inspired by vygotsky s theory of development 1998 as well as childhood sociology one of the aims has been to problematice time change continuity developmental trajectories and transitions in order to identify novel ways of discussing different trajectories through childhood and youth that is development

this book is the results of two conferences an invited session at the 2001 american anthropological association meetings and a mini conference and planning session at the african american studies program of the university of florida in 2002 preface

this book discusses the development of indigenous patterns of small scale complexity during the early bronze i and ii periods ca 3500 2700 bce in the southern levant aspects of methodology are outlined including an assessment of archaeological surveys and their limitations the book discusses the background to the emergence of complex societies during the fourth and third millennia bce suggesting that the southern levant was preadapted to cycles of rising and collapsing complexity by mechanisms of social decomposition and reformulation using settlement pattern data as a focal point the book synthesizes the available data for the emergence of early bronze ii urbanism and trade oriented economies in the southern levant from early bronze i village level organization stressing the importance of intersocietal contacts mediterranean crop production and highland lowland exchange the book is designed to synthesize the evidence for early urban development in the southern levant and to situate the discussion in terms generally associated with the large core civilizations of mesopotamia and egypt it therefore addresses issues of interest to scholars working in the southern levant as well as those seeking cross cultural perspectives on early complex societies

this study consists of a contextual analysis of a group of central anatolian neolithic settlements that includes the sites of aşıklı höyük canhasan iii Çatalhöyük erbaba and canhasan i and can be dated between 8500 and 5500 calibrated bc these settlements are characterised by a spatial organisation in which buildings are grouped in neighbourhood clusters and in which an estimated 30 to 40 households would have lived these

neighbourhoods lack streets and the buildings within them were accessed from the roof level the study explores the social significance of this form of organisation of settlement space at a number of levels first the nature of the individual buildings and how these related to household is investigated second non domestic features in these settlements such as sub floor burials are contextualised in order to identify status differentiation between buildings third the scale and composition of clustered neighbourhoods is studied to arrive at a better understanding of their significance finally the manner in which neighbourhoods in a settlement related to one another and the ways in which settlements were part of larger settlement systems is considered in this manner new light is shed on the social structure of these central anatolian neolithic communities

this book explores karchana a complex hindu village community of 35 castes and 3900 members living close to the holy ganges and celebrated centers of pilgrimage in the economically backward but politically and culturally very fascinating and influential eastern uttar pardesh region although classical in presenting a holistic account through field work and indology this work offers a new approach to the problem of writing culture based on the concepts of arena lifeworld and intersubjective fact

these volumes of studies in honour of manfred bietak include contributions from a wide variety of research areas articles deal with pre and proto dynastic periods in ancient egypt as well as with aspects of dynastic to modern times others focus on the interaction between egypt the levant cyprus the aegean and phoenicia whereas in another section minoan mycenaean and cypriote aspects are covered scholars from near eastern studies contributed as well as researchers working with nubian and meroitic material further articles cover issues from graeco roman egypt to classical studies and art history articles in a further section deal with sciences and chronology reflecting manfred bietak s interest in these subjects as well

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
