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like the first two editions of a guide to literary criticism and research this edition is based both on a recognition of a practical need felt in many literature courses and a view of literary study it attempts to meet the practical need by offering upper level students a condensed but adequate guide to the range of modern criticism and to basic methods of research in addition it is a hope that the book will give students a more comprehensive view of literary study by helping them to recognize criticism and research as two closely linked parts of a single process

this sophisticated and wide ranging look at literary criticism addresses the major theorists of today and proposes a constructive approach to challenging critical debates disclosing conflict as the inevitable outcome of historical change suresh raval refuses the stark either or choice between the foundationalist stance which seeks to find the right answers and the relativist position which denies the possibility of identifying right and wrong raval explores the question of conflict in literary criticism and theory by analyzing how different theories have treated key issues not to resolve these problems but to show why they resist decisive solution

each age has its value system of literary criticism whose construction is inseparable from the mainstream ideology of the society in contemporary china the mainstream ideology is inevitably marxism this book is composed of two parts the first part studies literary criticism in contemporary china whose development is closely related to the popularization of marxism and the unavoidable collisions between marxism and other theories it also introduces some relevant critical debates such as the debate on the criticism of yu pingbo a representative and one of the authoritative scholars studying the dream of the red chamber in the second part the author expounds the history of chinese literature from a macro level perspective involving works genres ideologies schools etc he also discusses the challenges facing chinese literature under the background of economic globalization will politics cultures including literature and arts be globalized in addition the author puts forward that a dynamic concept is needed for a better understanding of chinese culture and gives his suggestions about the adjustments chinese people should make for the present this book will attract scholars and students of literary criticism studies and chinese literary studies people who are interested in chinese literature and thought will also benefit from this book

originally published in 1947 this volume reviews the critical achievement at the renaissance it discusses the ideas of literature then current in england as revealed in contemporary theorizing and judgments the period has sometimes been dismissed as lacking great critics and the critical works themselves have been described as elementary and remote but as this work shows viewed in the light of what came before and after those texts will be found to be of considerable interest and possess intrinsic and historical value this book charts the course of the movement and the main findings and their significance in critical history there is an emphasis to show the part played by the medieval tradition with its inheritance of post classical and patristic doctrine the lead given by 15th century italian and other humanists and the no less important attempts of independent native writers to work out new artistic and dramatic theory of their own

no treatment of modern criticism is possible without discussing i a richards since in the most literal sense his influence combined with that of t s eliot and f r leavis served to create it as one of seminal thinkers paving the way for the development of new criticism richards made a systematic attempt to formulate a theory of poetry in consonance with the demands of modern scientific thought the present book stems from the need to offer an objective appraisal of richards thought system in the context of the evolution of his ideas in foundations of aesthetics the meaning of meaning principles of literary criticism science and poetry later reissued as poetries and sciences and practical criticism in the context of wide spread misinterpretations and distortions of richards point of view the author has tried throughout this interdisciplinary work to allow richards to speak for himself while unfolding the subtle suggestive and consistent nature of richards early writings the book studies his criticism of modern poets like t s eliot w b yeats g m hopkins thomas hardy and d h lawrence the chapter on practical criticism throws light on richards technique of evaluating poems and teaches the art of appreciating poetry
