this book has two primary objectives it teaches students fundamental concepts in discrete mathematics from counting to basic cryptography to graph theory and it teaches students proof writing skills with a wealth of learning aids and a clear presentation the book teaches students not only how to write proofs but how to think clearly and present cases logically beyond this course overall this book is an introduction to mathematics in particular it is an introduction to discrete mathematics all of the material is directly applicable to computer science and engineering but it is presented from a mathematician's perspective while algorithms and analysis appear throughout the emphasis is on mathematics students will learn that discrete mathematics is very useful especially those whose interests lie in computer science and engineering as well as those who plan to study probability statistics operations research and other areas of applied mathematics

the book aims at the identification of the organising concepts of some physical and biological phenomena by means of an analysis of the foundations of mathematics and of physics this is done in the perspective of unifying phenomena of bringing different conceptual universes into dialog the analysis of the role of order and of symmetries in the foundations of mathematics is linked to the main invariants and principles among which the geodesic principle a consequence of symmetries which govern and confer unity to the various physical theories moreover we attempt to understand causal structures a central element of physical intelligibility in terms of symmetries and their breakings the importance of the mathematical tool is also highlighted enabling us to grasp the differences in the models for physics and biology which are proposed by continuous and discrete mathematics such as computational simulations a distinction between principles of conceptual construction and principles of proofs both in physics and in mathematics guides this part of the work as for biology being particularly difficult and not as thoroughly examined at a theoretical level we propose a unification by concepts an attempt which should always precede mathematisation this constitutes an outline for unification also basing itself upon the highlighting of conceptual differences of complex points of passage of technical irreducibilities of one field to another indeed a monist point of view such as ours should not make us blind we the living objects are surely just big bags of molecules or at least this is our main metaphysical assumption the point though is which theory can help us to better understand these bags of molecules as they are indeed rather singular from the physical point of view technically this singularity is expressed by the notion of extended criticality a notion that logically extends the pointwise critical transitions in physics

an invitation to real analysis is written both as a stepping stone to higher calculus and analysis courses and as foundation for deeper reasoning in applied mathematics this book also provides a broader foundation in real analysis than is typical for future teachers of secondary mathematics in connection with this within the chapters students are pointed to numerous articles from the college mathematics journal and the american mathematical monthly these articles are inviting in their level of exposition and their wide ranging content axioms are presented with an emphasis on the distinguishing characteristics that new ones bring culminating with the axioms that define the reals set theory is another theme found in this book beginning with what students are familiar with from basic calculus this theme runs underneath the rigorous development of functions sequences and series and then ends with a chapter on transfinite cardinal numbers and with chapters on basic point set topology differentiation and integration are developed with the standard level of rigor but always with the goal of forming a firm foundation for the student who desires to pursue deeper study a historical theme interweaves throughout the book with many quotes and accounts of interest to all readers over 600 exercises and dozens of figures help the learning process several topics continued fractions for example are included in the appendices as enrichment material an annotated bibliography is included
