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this book provides a comprehensive introduction to the ways in which meaning is conveyed in language it covers topics normally considered to fall under pragmatics as well as semantic matters the author seeks above all to display and to explain the richness and subtlety of meaning and to that end provides abundant exemplification throughout the text numerous exercises and suggested answers are provided at every stage the book is not bound to any particular theory but provides explanations of theoretical approaches and perspectives as the context requires the author stresses the need for conceptual clarity in all analyses of meaning meaning in language is readable and vigorous written with style and wit it will be widely welcomed by students in linguistics philosophy and literature

this book provides an introduction to the study of meaning in human language from a linguistic perspective it covers a fairly broad range of topics including lexical semantics compositional semantics and pragmatics the chapters are organized into six units 1 foundational concepts 2 word meanings 3 implicature including indirect speech acts 4 compositional semantics 5 modals conditionals and causation 6 tense aspect most of the chapters include exercises which can be used for class discussion and or homework assignments and each chapter contains references for additional reading on the topics covered as the title indicates this book is truly an introduction it provides a solid foundation which will prepare students to take more advanced and specialized courses in semantics and or pragmatics it is also intended as a reference for fieldworkers doing primary research on under documented languages to help them write grammatical descriptions that deal carefully and clearly with semantic issues the approach adopted here is largely descriptive and non formal or in some places semi formal although some basic logical notation is introduced the book is written at level which should be appropriate for advanced undergraduate or beginning graduate students it presupposes some previous coursework in linguistics but does not presuppose any background in formal logic or set theory

realms of meaning presents an accessible introduction to semantics it provides an understanding of the way meaning works in natural languages against a background of how we communicate with language avoiding theoretical terminology and linguistic theories it concentrates instead on the analysis of meaning and looks in depth at such subjects as opposites and negatives modal verbs prepositions and word meanings examples are chosen mainly from english to provide material for the wider discussion of the principles of the subject but european east asian and other languages also provide illuminating examples

semantics refers to the meaning of words in a language and the meaning within a sentence it analyzes the meaning of a sentence without the context the field focuses on the relationships between words and objects words and the interpreters and between signs semantics is the meaning that the grammar and vocabulary convey it does not explain any implicit meaning in this sense the focus is on the general rules of language use pragmatic meaning analyzes the same words and grammar used in semantics but within context in each situation the different listeners in the conversation define the final meaning of the words based on other clues that lend subtext to the meaning this book studies analyses and upholds the pillars of semantics and pragmatics and their utmost significance it covers in detail some existent theories and innovative concepts revolving around the analysis of meaning for someone with an interest and eye for detail this book covers the most significant topics in this field
