franz kafka was one of the most influential novelists of the 20th century whose works came to be regarded after his death as one of the major achievements of world literature the trial german der process is a novel by franz kafka first published in 1925 one of kafka's best known works it tells the story of a man arrested and prosecuted by a remote inaccessible authority with the nature of his crime never revealed either to him or the reader like kafka's other novels the trial was never completed although it does include a chapter which brings the story to an end after his death in 1924 kafka's friend and literary executor max brod edited the text for publication on his thirtieth birthday a senior bank clerk josef k who lives in lodgings is unexpectedly arrested by two unidentified agents for an unspecified crime the agents do not name the authority for which they are acting he is not taken away however but left at home to await instructions from the committee of affairs k goes to visit the magistrate but instead is forced to have a meeting with an attendant's wife looking at the magistrate's books he discovers a cache of pornography k returns home to find fräulein montag a lodger from another room moving in with fräulein bürstner he suspects that this is to prevent him from pursuing his affair with the latter woman so begins the trial a much acclaimed
