# Mika Ninagawa Into Fiction Reality

yukio ninagawa 1935 2016 was japan s foremost director of shakespeare whose productions were acclaimed around the

world his work was lauded for its spectacular imagery its inventive use of japanese iconography and its striking fusion of eastern and western theatre traditions over a career spanning six decades ninagawa directed 31 of shakespeare s plays many of them including hamlet on multiple occasions his productions of macbeth the tempest pericles twelfth night and cymbeline became seminal events in world shakespeare production during the last 30 years this is the first english language book dedicated exclusively to ninagawa s work featuring an overview of his extraordinary output this study considers his shakespearean work within the context of his overall career individual chapters cover ninagawa s approach shakespeare and greek tragedy in particular his landmark productions of macbeth and medea and his eight separate productions of hamlet the volume includes a detailed analysis of the sai no kuni shakespeare series in which ninagawa set out to stage all of shakespeare s plays in his hometown of saitama north of tokyo written by conor hanratty who studied with ninagawa for over a year it offers a unique and unprecedented glimpse into the work and approach of one of the world s great theatre directors

poisoned cigars seductive apparitions minds and empires in the last of their decline and the most notorious kiss in dramatic history decadent plays challenged the moral as much as the dramatic imagination of their own day and continue to probe horizons of taste and the possibilities of stagecraft in the late 19th and early 20th centuries many writers reacted to urban modernity by embracing decadent themes and styles and dramatists were no exception decadence offered these writers a framework for exploring nonconformist identities and beliefs that challenged behavioural norms as much as the desirability of modern progress decadent plays were at once behind the times in their celebration of antiquity and forward thinking in their staging of themes that have become all the more timely in the 21st century including queerness unconventional eroticism and critiques of empire and industrial progress equally the diversity of decadent drama cannot be pigeon holed many of these plays still have the capacity to offend worldviews and invite us to interrogate present day conventions and propriety international in scope and eclectic in content this edited anthology is an authoritative and accessible introduction to a fast expanding field of decadent literature the first publication of its kind to deal with decadent drama and featuring plays translated into english for the first time decadent plays 1890 to 1930 breaks new ground by foregrounding decadence as a dramatic sensibility in this most pivotal of periods in the history of modern drama featuring canonical and little known works by oscar wilde michael field lesya ukrainka rachilde remy de gourmont

jean lorrain leonid andreyev gabriele d annunzio maurice maeterlinck izumi kyoka and djuna barnes this anthology is an essential introduction to decadent drama that will pique the interest of specialists and non specialists alike

this volume explores the changing process of evaluating objects during the period of japan s rapid modernization originally published in japanese antiquarians of nineteenth century japan looks at the approach toward object based research across the late tokugawa and early meiji periods which were typically kept separate and elucidates the intellectual continuities between these eras focusing on the top down effects of the professionalizing of academia in the political landscape of meiji japan which had advanced by attacking earlier modes of scholarship by antiquarians suzuki shows how those outside the government responded retracted or challenged new public rules and values he explores the changing process of evaluating objects from the past in tandem with the attitudes and practices of antiquarians during the period of japan s rapid modernization he shows their roots in the intellectual sphere of the late tokugawa period while also detailing how they adapted to the new era suzuki also demonstrates that japan s antiquarians had much in common with those from europe and the united states art historian maki fukuoka provides an introduction to the english translation that highlights the significance of suzuki s methodological and intellectual analyses and shows how his ideas will appeal to specialists and nonspecialists alike

classical drama on the modern stage as a cultural and political phenomenon is scholarly trailed since the 1950s and 60s and intensified in the last third of the twentieth century the evidence is being extensively documented pioneered by walton 1987 and mcdonald 1992 and subsequently developed by collaborative research projects which include published databases it is clear from the work of these projects that performance of classical drama is a major feature in all types of theatre avant garde and experimental student international and fringe epic and classical commercial popular and canonical this means that it is closely intertwined with the politics of locale environment and geography as well as of language translation and culture each of the essays has a specialised contribution to make however the total impact of the whole section will be even greater than the sum of the parts because the authors not only intersect in their discussions of common concerns in modern performance of ancient drama but also provide case studies that will add to the knowledge base and critical acumen of everyone working in the field

transfiguring women in late twentieth century japan feminists lesbians and girls comics artists and fans examines three dynamic and overlapping communities of women and adolescent girls who challenged japanese gender and sexual norms in the 1970s and 1980s these spheres encompassed activists in the ūman ribu women s liberation movement members of the rezubian lesbian community and artists and readers of queer shōjo manga girls comics individually and collectively they found the normative understanding of the category women untenable and worked to redefine and expand its meaning by transfiguring ideas images and practices selectively appropriated from the west they did so however while remaining firmly fixed on the local thus for many this ostensibly western focus was not a turn away from japan but integral to their understanding of being a woman within japan following broad historical overviews of the ūman ribu rezubian and queer shōjo manga spheres the book takes a deeper look through the lenses of terminology translation and travel to offer a window onto how acts of transfiguration reshaped what it meant to be a woman in japan the work draws on a vast archive that encompasses early twentieth century dictionaries sexology texts and literature postwar women s

and men s magazines and pornography translated feminist and lesbian texts comics and animation and newsletters fanzines and other heretofore largely unexamined ephemera the volume s characterization of the era is also greatly enriched by interviews with more than sixty individuals transfiguring women in late twentieth century japan demonstrates that the transfiguration of western culture into something locally meaningful had tangible effects beyond newly re created texts practices images and ideas within the ūman ribu rezubian and queer shōjo manga communities the individuals and groups involved were themselves transformed more broadly their efforts forged new understandings of women in japan creating space for a greater number of public roles not bound to being a mother or a wife as well as a greater diversity of gender and sexual expression that reached far beyond the japanese border

this book is about the losers of the meiji restoration and the supporters who promoted their legacy although the violence of the meiji restoration is typically downplayed the trauma was real and those who felt marginalized from the mainstream throughout modern japan looked to these losers as models of action using a wide range of sources from essays by former tokugawa supporters like fukuzawa yukichi to postwar film and lost decade manga michael wert traces the shifting portrayals of restoration losers by highlighting the overlooked sites of memory such as legends about buried gold the awarding of posthumous court rank or fighting over a disembodied head wert illustrates how the process of commemoration and rehabilitation allows individuals a voice in the formation of national history he argues that the commingling of local memory activists with nationally known politicians academics writers and treasure hunters formed interconnecting memory landscapes that promoted local figures as potential heroes in modern japan

this fascinating photography collection contains carefully selected pieces from four of ninagawa's photography collections such as everlasting flowers portraits of the time the days were beautiful and trans kyoto her stunning works are categorized in 8 themes which are sakura everlasting flowers the days were beautiful plant a tree self image trans kyoto portraits of the time into fiction reality this book also includes 3 special interviews with curators of art museums and organizations matthias harder who is a curator of halmut newton foundation takeshi sakurai who is a director of contemporary art museum simon baker who is a director of maison européenne de la photographie

structured around modes in which one might encounter asian themed performances and adaptations shakespeare and east asia identifies four themes that distinguish post 1950s east asian cinemas and theatres from works in other parts of the world japanese formalistic innovations in sound and spectacle reparative adaptations from china taiwan and hong kong the politics of gender and reception of films and touring productions in south korea and the uk and multilingual diaspora works in singapore and the uk these adaptations break new ground in sound and spectacle they serve as a vehicle for artistic and political remediation or in some cases the critique of the myth of reparative interpretations of literature they provide a forum where diasporic artists and audiences can grapple with contemporary issues and through

international circulation they are reshaping debates about the relationship between east asia and europe bringing film and theatre studies together this book sheds new light on the two major genres in a comparative context and reveals deep structural and narratological connections among asian and anglophone performances these adaptations are products of metacinematic and metatheatrical operations contestations among genres for primacy or experimentations with features of both film and theatre
