morals from motives defends its approach against criticisms that naturally occur to those skeptical of basing the morality of right and wrong action in independently admirable motives it also argues that ideally good people will in general be concerned about helping people rather than about conscientiously doing their duty but the book s largest positive aim is to show that virtue ethics isn t limited to ancient prototypes and can especially benefit from ideas deriving from eighteenth century moral sentimentalism and from recent thinking about the feminine morality of caring book jacket

knud ejler lögstrup s the ethical demand is the most original influential danish contribution to moral philosophy in this century this is the first time that the complete text has been available in english translation originally published in 1956 it has again become the subject of widespread interest in europe now read in the context of the whole of lögstrup s work the ethical demand marks a break not only with utilitarianism and with kantianism but also

with kierkegaard s christian existentialism and with all forms of subjectivism yet lögstrup s project is not destructive rather it is a presentation of an alternative understanding of interpersonal life the ethical demand presupposes that all interaction between human beings involves a basic trust its content cannot be derived from any rule for lögstrup there is not christian morality and secular morality there is only human morality

in this fresh and powerfully argued book mark bernstein identifies the qualities that make an entity deserving of moral consideration it is frequently assumed that only normal human beings count bernstein argues instead for experientialism the view that having conscious experiences is necessary and sufficient for moral standing he demonstrates that this position requires us to include many non human animals in our moral realm but not to the extent that many deep ecologists champion

mary anne warren explores a theoretical question which lies at the heart of practical ethics what are the criteria for having moral status in other words what are the criteria for being an entity towards which people have moral obligations some philosophers maintain that there is one intrinsic property for instance life sentience humanity or moral agency others believe that relational properties such as belonging to a human community are more important in part i of the book warren argues that no single property can serve as the sole criterion for moral status instead life sentience moral agency and social and biotic relationships are all relevant each in a different way she presents seven basic principles each focusing on a property that can in combination with others legitimately affect an agent s moral obligations towards entities of a given type in part ii these principles are applied in an examination of three controversial ethical issues voluntary euthanasia abortion

interest in schopenhauer has increased noticeably in recent years published here is one of his key works which has been out of print for a long time in the form of payne s definitive translation this work is one of the most significant nineteenth century treatises on ethics it is also schopenhauer s most extended discussion of traditional themes in ethics and presents a descriptive ethics radically at odds with rationally based prescriptive ethical theories schopenhauer begins this book with a wide ranging critique of kant s ethics one that anticipates the work of contemporary critics of modern moral philosophy like that of g e m anscombe philippa foot and richard taylor schopenhauer argues that compassion is the basis of morality and in so doing presents a virtue ethics in which passion and desire are viewed as the keys for explaining different moral characters behaviours and world views in the concluding part of his essay schopenhauer sketches his metaphysics of morals using kant s transcendental idealism as a ground for stressing both the interconnectiveness of being and the affinity of his ethics to eastern thought
