professionals education examples include how cultural context influences the ways in which students respond to teachers how teachers giving feedback to students and the challenges of peer feedback and group work the authors also examine causes for student hesitation in proposing ideas the pervasive cultural norm of maintaining harmony the challenges of teamwork in clinical settings the need to be sensitive to community health needs the complexity of clinical decision making and the challenge of how collectivist cultural values play into group dynamics this book aims to advocate a more culturally sensitive approach to educating health professionals and will be relevant to both students and practitioners in numerous areas of public health and medical education
