this book offers a new account of the transitive particle verb construction in english the main emphasis is on the alternation between the two word orders possible in english continuous hand in the manuscript vs discontinuous hand the manuscript in the central aim is to show that the choice of the word order is not optional as has often been claimed in related literature on the topic and that a syntactic analysis should thus not be based on optional movement operations or optional feature selection the author argues in some detail that the choice of the word order is determined to a great extent by the information structuring of the context in which the relevant construction is embedded the syntactic structure she develops is based on a substantial combination of empirical facts evidence from theoretical research and the results of two experimental studies on the intonation patterns of the construction

this volume addresses issues that have arisen in post gricean pragmatic theory among the specific topics covered are scalar implicatures lexical semantics and pragmatics indexicality procedural meaning the semantics and pragmatics of negation the volume includes both defences and critiques of relevance theory and of neo gricean pragmatics

the author integrates expands and deepens his previous publications about irregular or metalinguistic negations a total of ten distinct negatives several previously unclassified are analyzed the logically irregular negations deny different implicatures of their root all are partially non compositional but completely conventional the author argues that two of the irregular negative meanings are implicatures the others are semantically rather than pragmatically ambiguous since their ambiguity is neither lexical nor structural direct irregular negatives satisfy the standard definition of idioms as syntactically complex expressions whose meaning is non compositional unlike stereotypical idioms idiomatic negatives lack fixed syntactic forms and are highly compositional the final chapter analyzes other free form idioms including irregular interrogatives and comparatives self restricted verb phrases numerical verb phrases and transparent propositional attitude and speech act reports

it is a point of debate to what extent and according to which principles the syntactic behavior of verbs can be derived from their semantic representations and how it can be affected by lexical or syntactic operations this collection of articles brings together insights from the research on verbs whose semantic structure has been made more complex by the incorporation of a particle a prefix a verbal or a nominal element a list of the constructions and languages that are discussed includes particle and prefix verbs in english and german resultative constructions in english danish and spanish psych verbs in english and german and compound verbs in greek chinese and persian

this manual outlines a framework for the analysis of syntactic grammar from a perspective of a systemic functional grammar in part the book goes back to the grammar s scale and category roots but now with the aim of presenting a descriptive framework which shows how the analysis of the syntactic structure can reflect the meaning structure the contents are divided into four sections the first gives a brief overview of systemic grammar including the linguistic system context of situation and language functions developing the lexicogrammar the second section considers formal units and their classes but the principal focus is in section three which covers the role of units as elements of structure the argumentation also takes on board some approaches by other grammarians the text is illustrated with examples throughout and the fuller analytical frameworks are also shown in summary chapters section four discusses areas of structural complexity and concludes with several refinements to the analysis format

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
