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how do differences in language influence comparative philosophy although the orientalism famously described by

edward said is rare today steven burik maintains that comparative philosophy often subtly privileges one tradition over another since certain conceptual schemes are so embedded in western languages that it is difficult not to revert to them arguing for a new approach that acknowledges how theory and practice cannot be separated in comparative philosophical endeavors burik provides nonmetaphysical deconstructionist readings of heidegger and derrida and uses these to give a new reading of classical daoism the ideas of language advanced therein can aid the project of comparative philosophy specifically and philosophies generally in trying to overcome ways of thinking that have dominated western philosophy for twenty five hundred years and still frustrate intercultural encounters

this collection of essays is an exercise in comparative philosophy of religion that explores the different ways in which humans express the inexpressible it brings together scholars of over a dozen religious literary and artistic traditions as part of the comparison project s 2013 15 lecture and dialogue series on religion beyond words specialist scholars first detailed the grammars of ineffability in nine different religious traditions as well as the adjacent fields of literature poetry music and art the comparison project s directors then compared this diverse set of phenomena offering explanations for their patterning and raising philosophical questions of truth and value about religious ineffability in comparative perspective this book is the inaugural publication of the comparison project an innovative new approach to the philosophy of religion housed at drake university des moines iowa usa the comparison project organizes a biennial series of scholar lectures practitioner dialogues and comparative panels about core cross cultural topics in the philosophy of religion specialist scholars of religion first explore this topic in their religions of expertise comparativist philosophers of religion then raise questions of meaning truth and value about this topic in comparative perspective the comparison project stands apart from traditional approaches to the philosophy of religion in its commitment to religious inclusivity it is the future of the philosophy of religion in a diverse global world

our world has evolved in such a way that we can no longer reduce it to just a market it has also become an agora where philosophers exchange world views in order to understand one another europe has lost its position at the centre of the world and should stop pretending it holds the one true religion philosophy economy and science instead we should turn our attention to fulfilling the dream of erasmus reflected in his statement i wish to be a citizen of the world first and foremost we should learn to play fair when comparing different cultures and not rely on exclusively western criteria this book explains how a comparative model based on the paradigm free axes of energy and information accommodates the current world views of taoism buddhism and rationalism representing chinese indian and western heritages respectively and shows how science and religion interrelate within such a global framework

comparative philosophy is a relatively new field of study research achievement in understanding and teaching the purpose of this work is to help clarify the nature of comparative philosophy to survey views about the kinds of standards that may be used as bases for comparisons and the propose an hypothesis comparing pervasive traits of the philosophies of western indian and chinese civilizations

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what is comparative philosophy this question is ultimately a methodological one according to this much needed book the cultivation of area studies in diverse traditions has opened up opportunities for cross cultural understanding that have rarely existed before and comparative philosophy is a rapidly emerging area of inquiry yet surprisingly little has been written on comparative methodology in philosophy of course there is much at stake in how we compare things how comparison is done determines what comparison is author robert w smid provides a critical review of four of the most influential comparative methodologies within the american pragmatist and process philosophical traditions those of william ernest hocking f s c northrop robert cummings neville and david l hall in collaboration with roger t ames discussing the history of each methodology s development and critically assessing its strengths and weaknesses smid demonstrates that it is possible to compare methods as well as traditions and encourages those interested to join the contemporary conversation

this collection of essays highlights that despite its history of conflict bosnia and herzegovina has a real enthusiasm for comparative philosophy it illustrates the role of this type of philosophy in bosnian culture and links it with developments in other parts of the world and other cultures part one consists of essays that have appeared in slightly revised versions in a number of journals and books that focus on relevant resources introducing this field in our region and especially bosnia and herzegovina while part two consists of interviews with prominent scholars outside of this country the book examines the challenges confronting the teaching of comparative philosophy within the university level philosophy curriculum in bosnia and herzegovina and the surrounding countries in the balkans a part of the world where multicultural societies are the norm facing the twenty first century these confluences and cross currents are increasingly gaining importance especially in this region with a comparativism of ethnocentrism and multiculturalism becoming a way of challenging stereotypes
