one stop resource for courses in medieval literature providing students with a comprehensive guide to the historical and cultural context major texts and movements reading primary and critical texts key critics concepts and topics major critical approaches and directions of new research

this book explores the issues faced by immigrant children through the lens of children's literature the authors employ the unconventional of the rights of the child the lens of equity and Freire's principles of critical consciousness as a framework for analysing children's literature and immigration they focus on circumstances and experiences of immigration from the perspective of young children who are leaving their homelands and growing up as immigrants the book focuses primarily on children from birth to 8 years old but with crossover and implications for older children the chapters reveal the

social economic and political issues faced by child immigrants refugees and asylees throughout the global context viewed through and alongside children's literature the book provides suggestions for the implementation of children's literature in the curriculum and provides tools for educators and researchers working with immigrant and refugee children showing how they can better understand their students and families a variety of children's literature is covered including analysis of works by jairo buitrigo yanksook choi sandra leguen rosemary mccartney bao phi and jeanette winter

an exciting new contribution to the expanding but still largely uncharted territory of collaboration studies late victorian literary collaboration is the first book length study of the trend for collaborative writing that emerged in the last decades of the nineteenth century as a result of the rapidly growing literary market the years between 1870 and the turn of the century witnessed an unprecedented flow of collaboratively written novels in the 1890s co authorship became a craze with literary partnerships multiplying and fiction co written by twenty and more authors appearing in the pages of popular magazines by 1900 however the trend had already reversed and it quickly slipped into oblivion late victorian literary collaboration investigates the factors that made the period so conducive to collaboration tracing the reasons for its success and subsequent decline drawing on a vast range of original sources the book discusses and compares different models of collaboration from life long exclusive partnerships to one time widely advertised collaborative ventures between best selling novelists it deals with authors such as walter besant somerville and ross andrew lang h r haggard and rhoda broughton all favourites of the victorian public but subsequently neglected and only recently reevaluated by unpacking the debate that developed around co authorship in the periodical press of the time the book also sheds light on how collaborative authorship was imagined by the general public and illustrates how the trend effectively if temporarily challenged victorian assumptions about the author as a solitary genius

in this sweeping revision of a text that has become an authoritative standard expert instructor and librarian peggy johnson addresses the art of controlling and updating library collections whether located locally or accessed remotely each chapter offers complete coverage of one aspect of collection development and management including numerous suggestions for further reading and narrative case studies exploring the issues

as eighteenth century scholarship expands its range and disciplinary boundaries such as enlightenment and romanticism are challenged novels published during the rich period from 1750 to 1832 have become a contested site of critical overlap in this volume scholars who typically write under the rubric of either the long eighteenth century or romanticism examine novels often claimed by both scholarly periods this shared enterprise opens new and rich discussions of novels and novelistic concerns by creating dialogue across scholarly boundaries dominant narratives critical approaches and methodological assumptions differ in important ways but these differences reveal a

productive tension among the issues engaged are the eighteenth century novel's development of emotional interiority including theories of melancholia the troubling heritage of the epistolary novel for the 1790s radical novel tensions between rationality and romantic affect issues of aesthetics and politics and constructions of gender genre and race rather than positing a simple opposition between an eighteenth century enlightenment of rationality propriety and progress and a romantic period of inspiration heroic individualism and sublime emotionality these essays trace the putatively romantic in the early 1700s as well as the long legacy of enlightenment values and ideas well into the nineteenth century the volume concludes with responses from Patricia Meyer Spacks and Stephen C. Behrendt who situate the essays and elaborate on the stakes

The *Historical Dictionary of Romanticism in Literature* provides a large overview of the romantic movement that seemed at the time to have swept across Europe from Russia to Germany and France to Britain and across the Atlantic to the United States the romantics saw themselves as inaugurating a new era they frequently referred to themselves or their contemporaries as romantics and their art as romantic from the early stirrings in Germany to the last decade of the eighteenth century in England with the political radicals and the Lake Poets to the Transcendental Club in Massachusetts the leaders of the age acknowledged their new romantic attitudes this volume takes a close and comprehensive look at romanticism in literature through a chronology an introductory essay appendixes and an extensive bibliography the dictionary section has over 800 cross referenced entries on the writers and the poems novels short stories and essays plays and other works they produced the leading trends techniques journals and literary circles and the spirit of the times are also covered this book is an excellent access point for students researchers and anyone wanting to know more about romanticism in literature

Edward Ragg's study was the first to examine the role of abstraction throughout the work of Wallace Stevens by tracing the poet's interest in abstraction from *Harmonium* through to his later works. Ragg argues that Stevens only fully appreciated and refined this interest within his later career. Ragg's detailed close readings highlight the poet's absorption of late nineteenth century and early twentieth century painting as well as the examples of philosophers and other poets' work.
