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education and skill development the need of the nation in the 21st century is a book written by dr nadeem malik an indian entrepreneur and social worker and

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focusing on the asia pacific region which in recent years has been the engine of global economic growth this volume surveys trends and prospects in technical and vocational education and training tvet with particular reference to achieving inclusive growth and the greening of economies underlying the increasing pressure for new models of tvet provision is the rapid pace of technological change demand for a work force which is highly responsive to evolving needs and a transforming market place that calls for higher order skills and lifelong learning the book proposes a re engineered modernized tvet system that fosters an innovative approach which enhances the employability of workers as well as the sustainability of their livelihoods the book includes contributions from leading policy makers researchers and practitioners including those in the private sector in analyzing and forecasting the most urgent priorities in skills development the book argues for creative approaches to tvet design and delivery particularly with a view to improve job prospects and meeting the goals of inclusion sustainable development and social cohesion addressing issues such as the chronic mismatches between skills acquired and actual skills required in the work place the volume proposes diversified approaches towards workforce development and partnerships with the private sector to improve the quality and relevance of skills development the new imperatives created by greening economies and responses required in skills development and training are addressed developing tvet is a high priority for governments in the asia pacific region as they seek to achieve long term sustainable growth since the continued success of their economic destinies depend on it the volume also includes an emerging framework for skills development for inclusive and sustainable growth in the asia and pacific region

this book highlights some of kenneth king s diverse contributions to international and comparative education african studies and development studies over more than four decades from his pioneering work on the first educational commissions to africa through his research on skills training in the informal sector and on to his critical analysis of education analysis in development agencies this book makes influential materials available in one place appropriately it illustrates his career long connections with kenya but also his more recent engagement with japan china and india it is the first cerc volume to pay significant attention to the policies and politics of skills development kenneth king is an emeritus professor of the university of edinburgh he was based in and directed its centre of african studies for many years and lectured on international perspectives in education and training in its school of education his research interests have addressed the politics and planning of skills development including in the informal sector of the economy aid policies towards education of both western and asian donors and higher education cooperation he founded norrag the network for international policies and cooperation in education and training in 1986 and edited norrag news until 2016 he was president of the british association for international and comparative education baice from 2014 2016 and was one of the founding members of the uk forum on international education and training ukfiet

the last decade has seen radical changes in higher education long held assumptions about university and academic autonomy have been shattered as public and political interest in quality standards and accountability have intensified efforts for reform the increased influence of the state and employers in the curriculum of higher education is exemplified by the increasing emphasis on so called core or transferable skills an emphasis supported by the dearing report which identified what is called key skills as necessary outcomes of all higher education programmes however there is little research evidence to support such assertions or to underpin the identification of good practice in skill development in higher education or employment settings further prescription has outrun the conceptualisation of such skills little attention has been paid to their theoretical underpinning and definitions or to assumptions concerning their transfer
