one act plays for school and theatre is dedicated to children of all ages this fountainhead of its

kind inspires a new way of seeing and saying its a journey for students to theater kingdom with themes that are topical the world over a string of eight plays is categorized for each age group comprising of 811 1214 and 1517 years this helps the theater person to put in minimum efforts for selection and presentation of the play with the appropriate age group of children hence plays for the first group focus on their curiosity and imagination i e thinking skills and being able to communicate the most sensitive age group 1214 interacts with the world around they are given enough space to create and construct the script and also to innovate on the stage with their collaborative skills they confidently initiate smooth changes without disturbing the theme in the third group the young adult naturals to the core are allowed to own interactive ability the young adult is ready to execute in an eloquent voice and commanding stage presence they learn from each other while analyzing characters and story elements that focus on social causes thereby creating and shaping relationships that are therapeutic

eugene o neill nobel laureate in literature and pulitzer prize winner is widely known for his full length plays however his one act plays are the foundation of his work both thematically and stylistically they telescope his later plays this collection aims to fill the gap by examining these texts during what can be considered o neill s formative writing years and the foundational period of american drama a wide ranging investigation into o neill s one acts the contributors shed light on a less explored part of his career and assist scholars in understanding o neill s entire oeuvre

the peak of my virtuosity was in the one act plays some of which are like firecrackers on a rope tennessee williams tennessee williams s lesser known one act plays reveal a tantalising and fascinating perspective to one of the world s most important playwrights written between 1934 and 1980 the plays of the very young writer then of the successful tennessee williams and finally of the troubled man of the 1970s this volume offers a panoramic yet detailed view of the themes demons and wit of this iconic playwright the volume depicts american life during the great

depression and after populated by a hopelessly hopeful chorus girl a munitions manufacturer ensnared in a love triangle a rural family that deals justice on its children an overconfident mob dandy a poor couple who quarrel to vanquish despair a young spinster enthralled by the impulse of rebellion and in the magic tower a passionate artist and his wife whose youth and optimism are not enough to protect their dream marriage this collection gathers some of williams s most exuberant early work and includes one acts that he would later expand to powerful full length dramas the pretty trap a cheerful take on the glass menagerie and interior panic a precursor to a streetcar named desire plays included are at liberty the magic tower me vashya curtains for the gentleman in our profession every twenty minutes honor the living the cast of the crushed petunias moony s kid don t cry the dark room the pretty trap interior panic kingdom of earth i never get dressed till after dark on sundays and some problems for the moose lodge the volume also features a foreword by terence mcnally

the one act play stands apart as a distinct art form with some well known writers providing specialist material among them bernard shaw tom stoppard harold pinter caryl churchill alan ayckbourn edward albee and tennesee williams there are also lesser known writers with plenty of material to offer yet sourcing one act plays to perform is notoriously hard this companion is the first book to survey the work of over 250 playwrights in an illuminating a z guide multiple styles nationalities and periods are covered offering a treasure trove of compelling moments of theatre waiting to be discovered guidance on performing and staging one act plays is also covered as well as essential contact information and where to apply for performance rights a chapter introducing the history of the one act play rounds off the title as a definitive guide

the six one person plays included in this collection are ideal for actors looking to showcase their talents at solo performance theatre festivals whose popularity has grown exponentially in recent years poignant sometimes heart wrenching sometimes heart warming and frequently witty each

piece allows the actor to explore a multifaceted well rounded character that will demonstrate their skills at their finest and fullest they say never judge a book by its cover but it s something many of us are apt to do at some point judging a person by their appearance is equally unwise as none of us can know the personal turmoil behind the public facade of a perfect stranger but what if we could juxtaposing the public face with the private conflicted person behind it these solo plays present an actor with the opportunity to truly immerse themselves in the mind of the character they re portraying haunting intense totally engaging the concordian a masterly collection by an excellent writer author a j moreton

high drama and some low comedy in these two one act plays by novelist anne m holmes in that s nice we meet charlotte and emily two senior editors at chatsworth son a publishing house once known for the quality of its authors now charlotte is stuck with the tortured prose of greville marshall and emily must cope with the fragrant euphemisms of millicent carruthers they hide out in the staff lunch room trying to figure out how they can wash their hands of these hacks an unhelpful complication is set in a council flat in south london in 1992 where recently appointed tory cabinet minister sir ambrose carrick is reunited with war correspondent maggie mcarthur a woman he first met a world away and a lifetime ago both have secrets they will protect at any cost this is a battle of wits who will still be standing at the end

the american playwright and actor william gillette is best remembered today for the role of sherlock holmes that he first created for the stage in 1899 and played for more than thirty years gillette also adapted foreign plays for the american stage and wrote strong melodramas and spy stories in which he frequently appeared himself this volume includes all the comforts of home 1890 secret service 1895 and sherlock holmes 1899 gillette s sure grasp of the keys to theatrical success together with his technical innovations makes him an interesting and important theatre figure in his time as playwright and player he achieved a new combination of melodramatic

suspense with a cool understated acting style these three plays represent the range of his dramatic talent

herald a viking warrior returns to his island with afton an english slave girl

the principle of economy of force applies even at the stage of conceiving a play many good ideas can be put across on the stage in a short play or a one act play they need not be put on the rack and stretched to a full length script it is cruelty to the audience this is the reason so many full length plays in english in india are bright and attractive in the first half an hour and run out of steam after the intermission not surprisingly many movie scripts are the same we have avoided the label one act plays preferring to call this compilation short plays one act plays had a historical context in the west and served that context well the context is different today especially in countries like india where the ecosystem of theatre performances makes its own demands on the performers the short play has a legitimate place here a one act play will qualify as a short play but not all short plays are one act plays and then there are the sketches how does one define a sketch theatre folks have not found a satisfactory definition yet the last sketch in this volume ringaling has no spoken word it is done entirely with moves and sound effects a wide variety of ring tones of mobile phones

this book rediscovers and re evaluates the work of the welsh dramatist j o francis 1882 1954 and his contribution to the development of welsh drama in the twentieth century more than a prize winning dramatist whose plays were performed all over the world francis can also be described as one of the founding fathers of modern welsh drama whose work has helped establish theatrical realism on the welsh stage his creative non fiction for the popular press and for radio gives a unique perspective on how wales was seen through the eyes of a perceptive london welsh observer using much previously unpublished material this volume is an excellent introduction to one of wales s foremost dramatists and is innovative in the way that it creates a picture of the
