donald allen's prophetic anthology had an electrifying effect on two generations at least of american poets and readers more than the repetition of familiar names and ideas that most anthologies seem to be about here was the declaration of a collective intelligent and thoroughly visionary work in progress the primary example for its time of the anthology as manifesto its republication today complete with poems statements on poetics and autobiographical projections provides us again with a model of how a contemporary anthology can and should be shaped in these essentials it remains as fresh and useful a guide as it was in 1960 jerome rothenberg editor of poems for the millennium the new american poetry is a crucial cultural document central to defining the poetics and the broader cultural dynamics of a particular historical moment alan golding author of from outlaw to classic canons in american poetry

albert gelpi's american poetry after modernism is a study of sixteen major american poets of the postwar period from robert lowell to adrienne rich gelpi argues that a distinctly american poetic tradition was solidified in the later half the twentieth century thus severing it from british conventions

colonies and the south newly emerged from the archives along with familiar favorites by phillis wheatley celebrated pioneer of the african american tradition in poetry are little known verses by benjamin banneker known as the sable astronomer and african american minuteman lemuel haynes the anthology includes hymns recently attributed to mohegan preacher samson occom and the earliest known translation of a traditional native american chant henry timberlake s cherokee war song the unpublished poems of henry brooke elizabeth graeme fergusson joseph green hannah griffitts margaret lowther page and annis boudinot stockton among others reflect the rediscovered vitality and importance of manuscript exchange as a form of publication in an era when it was sometimes considered indecorous especially for women to appear in print unprecedented in its textual authority and unrivaled in its scope the anthology includes newly researched biographical sketches of each poet and extensive notes library of america is an independent nonprofit cultural organization founded in 1979 to preserve our nation s literary heritage by publishing and keeping permanently in print america s best and most significant writing the library of america series includes more than 300 volumes to date authoritative editions that average 1 000 pages in length feature cloth covers sewn bindings and ribbon markers and are printed on premium acid free paper that will last for centuries

american poetry a very short introduction proposes a new theory of american poetry written in engaging language and enlivened with illuminating examples it shows that two characteristics mark the vast contentious literature on the one hand several of its major poets and critics claim that america needs a poetry equal to the country s own distinctiveness on the other hand american poetry welcomes techniques styles and traditions that originate from outside the country its influences range far beyond america s borders the force of these two competing characteristics drives both individual accomplishment and the broader field

with contributions from over 100 scholars the encyclopedia of american poetry the nineteenth century provides essays on the careers works and backgrounds of more than 100 nineteenth century poets it also provides entries on specialized categories of twentieth century verse such as hymns folk ballads spirituals

civil war songs and native american poetry besides presenting essential factual information each entry amounts to an in depth critical essay and includes a bibliography that directs readers to other works by and about a particular poet

by 1940 the revolution we call modernism had run its course the battle against the nineteenth century had been won with time s help and the poetry of experimentation was so secure that it became a new academicism whereas we had gone out of our way in earlier decades to make a pact with the most radical poet of the nineteenth century walt whitman we accepted quite matter of factly our association with longfellow in fact it is part of the character of american poetry since 1940 to have made friends with everyone mark strand from the preface

this book examines donald m allen s crucially influential poetry anthology the new american poetry 1945 1960 from the perspectives of american cold war nationalism and literary transnationalism considering how the anthology expresses and challenges cold war norms claiming post war anglophone poetic innovation for the united states and reflecting the conservative american society of the 1950s examining the crossroads of politics social life and literature during the cold war this book puts allen s anthology into its historical context and reveals how the editor was influenced by the volatile climate of nationalism and politics that pervaded every aspect of american life during the cold war reconsidering the dramatic influence that allen s anthology has had on the way we think about and anthologize american poetry and recontextualizing the new american poetry as a document of the cold war this study not only helps us come to a more accurate understanding of how the anthology came into being but also encourages new ways of thinking about all of anglophone poetry from the twentieth century and today

in the 1830s alexis de toqueville prophesied that american writers would slight even despise form that they would favor the sensational over rational order he suggested that this attitude was linked to a distinct concept of democracy in america exposing the inaccuracies of such claims when applied to poetry stephen cushman maintains that american poets tend to overvalue the formal aspects of their art and in turn overestimate the relationship between those formal aspects and various ideas of america in this book cushman examines poems and prose statements in which poets as diverse as emily dickinson and ezra pound describe their own poetic forms and he investigates links and analogies between poets notions of form and their notions of Americanness the
