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this is an open access book the book provides an overview of the state of research in developing countries africa latin america and asia especially india and why research and publications are important in these regions it addresses budding but struggling academics in low and middle income countries it is written mainly by senior colleagues who have experienced and recognized the challenges with design documentation and publication of health research in the developing world the book includes short chapters providing insight into planning research at the undergraduate or postgraduate level issues related to research ethics and conduct of clinical trials it also serves as a guide towards establishing a research question and research methodology it covers important concepts such as writing a paper the submission process dealing with rejection and revisions and
