with disabilities receive a high quality education that positions them for lifelong success in IEPs. The guide offers examples of accommodations and instructional supports to include in a student's IEP to help him/her meet IEP goals as well as math and literacy standards. Specially designed instruction may include, among other things, the involvement of additional service providers, instructional strategies based on universal design for learning (UDL) principles, assistive technology devices and services incorporating the student's interests and strengths. Five scenarios are provided to demonstrate a variety of ways instruction can be individualized for students with specific classifications, strengths, and interests. The guide also outlines a step-by-step approach for helping students with IEPs achieve the standards. Additional online and print resources are also included, making this guide a valuable quick reference tool for IEP team members.
