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to derrida and deconstruction available in any language responding to questions put to him at a roundtable held at villanova university in 1994 jacques derrida leads the reader through an illuminating discussion of the central themes of deconstruction speaking in english and extemporaneously derrida takes up with unusual clarity and great eloquence such topics as the task of philosophy the greeks justice responsibility the gift community and the messianic derrida refutes the charges of relativism that are often leveled at deconstruction by its critics and sets forth the profoundly affirmative and ethico political thrust of his work the roundtable is marked by an unusual clarity that continues into the second part of the book in which one of derrida s most influential readers john d caputo elaborates upon derrida s comments and supplies material for further discussion this edition also includes a substantial new introduction by caputo that discusses the original context of the book and traces the development of deconstruction since derrida s death in 2004 from the rise of new materialisms to return to religion long one of the most lucid and reliable introductions to derrida and deconstruction available in any language and an ideal volume for students deconstruction in a nutshell will also prove illuminating for those already familiar with derrida s work

striking out from a number of new headings and in a number of new directions each of the essays in this collection pushes at the borders of their topics disciplines and ways of thinking providing innovative and inventive insights into the work and application of jacques derrida on a diverse range of themes including irish identity communication ethics love tele technology victorian studies the limits of philosophy translation otherness and literature demonstrating that today despite repeated accusations over recent years that the work of derrida has become passe there is more vitality and spirit in engaging with the writings of derrida than ever before

first published in 1967 writing and difference a collection of jacques derrida s essays written between 1959 and 1966 has become a landmark of contemporary french thought in it we find derrida at work on his systematic deconstruction of western metaphysics the book s first half which includes the celebrated essay on descartes and foucault shows the

development of derrida s method of deconstruction in these essays derrida demonstrates the traditional nature of some purportedly nontraditional currents of modern thought one of his main targets being the way in which structuralism unwittingly repeats metaphysical concepts in its use of linguistic models the second half of the book contains some of derrida s most compelling analyses of why and how metaphysical thinking must exclude writing from its conception of language finally showing metaphysics to be constituted by this exclusion these essays on artaud freud bataille hegel and lovi strauss have served as introductions to derrida s notions of writing and difference the untranslatable formulation of a nonmetaphysical concept that does not exclude writing for almost a generation of students of literature philosophy and psychoanalysis writing and difference reveals the unacknowledged program that makes thought itself possible in analyzing the contradictions inherent in this program derrida goes on to develop new ways of thinking reading and writing new ways based on the most complete and rigorous understanding of the old ways scholars and students from all disciplines will find writing and difference an excellent introduction to perhaps the most challenging of contemporary french thinkers challenging because derrida questions thought as we know it
