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publisher description john dewey 1859 1952 believed that learning was active and schooling unnecessarily long and restrictive his idea was that children came to school to do things and live in a community which gave them real guided experiences which fostered their capacity to contribute to society for example dewey believed that students should be involved in real life tasks and challenges maths could be learnt via learning proportions in cooking or figuring out how long it would take to get from one place to another by mule history could be learnt by experiencing how people lived geography what the climate was like and how plants and animals grew were important

subjects dewey had a gift for suggesting activities that captured the center of what his classes were studying dewey s education philosophy helped forward the progressive education movement and spawned the development of experiential education programs and experiments
